### MISSIONS THROUGH THE ARTS

Thank You for supporting and helping us raise money for MISSIONS THROUGH THE ARTS through the Valentine Banquet. This money will help all of the students defer some of the cost for the trip. The next Banquet will be the evening of June 2<sup>nd</sup> at 5:30 pm and our Student Choir will be presenting Rise & Shine which is the musical side of Mission's Through the Arts. The money raised will help with the mission side of the mission project. We will let you know more about that later.

We will be leaving at 6:00 am on June 6th and returning on June 9th. The trip will have several components to it. We will do a **Block Party** (to help the church get into the community), as well as singing and witnessing at **Point Orlando** and of course we will have several Work Projects.

This year our **Work Projects** will be a joint effort with *Matthews Hope, Next Community Church and Do Good Farms* in Winter Garden. Scott Billue, the Pastor of Next Community Church began working with the homeless 7 years ago. We will be helping them with some construction work renovating/ landscaping. We will also be helping with a ministry partner of theirs called *Do Good Farms*, which provides food for the homeless locally and globally. More details to come.

*Matthew's Hope* is a central location within walking distance of 20 tent communities on the east side of Orange County. Also, many of you have asked *How can I help?* There are three ways: first you can pray. Pray for Pastor Scott & I as we continue to pray about how we can best help them in the time we have together in Orlando. Second, get a ticket to the banquet in June to help us defer some of the expenses while doing the projects, and third, there are some that need help beyond what were able to help. Many of you help us with a scholarship to help someone on the trip. If you can help with some or even part of a scholarship it would be deeply appreciated. The cost for one person is \$190.00.

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be glory both now and forever! Amen" II Peter 3:8

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – His good, pleasing and perfect will." Rom. 12:2

Meaningful change is probably one of the most difficult things for us to successfully accomplish in our lives. We get into our comfort zones. We form habits, develop patterns, get in ruts and settle into preconceived mindsets about ourselves. Once we're there, it's hard to change some of those patterns and habits to which we've grown accustomed. But, changing and growing is part of what being a disciple of Jesus Christ is all about!

If we examine Jesus' life closely, much of the way He lived was about change – changing traditions, religions, relationships, and lives. And He wants to do that in our lives too. He wants to change and transform us from what we are today into what He has called us to be. Why bother even following Christ in the first place if, in the end, we aren't really willing to be different? Dr. Howard Hendricks, a distinguished professor at Dallas Theological Seminary says:

"I must keep growing and changing. The Word of God, of course, does not change, but my understanding of it does change because I am a developing individual. That is why Peter could tell us at the end of his second epistle, 'Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.' Such a philosophy requires an attitude that you have not yet 'arrived.' A person who applies this principle...is always asking, 'How can I improve?" (Dr. Howard Hendricks, Teaching to Change Lives 17 (1987))

If we are truly going to be a disciple of Christ, we've got to learn more about Him, let what we learn deepen our relationship with Him and let that relationship change and transform us. Then we can go our and be "salt and light." (mt. 5:13-16) Think of it like this:

"The simplest definition...of learning is this: Learning is change. Essentially, learning means a change in your thinking, a change in your feeling, a change in your behavior. Learning means that a change takes place in the mind, in the emotions, and in the will ...Paul says, "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind." It's by transforming...Change. Radical change. Thus we are conformed to the likeness of God's son." (Hendricks, 88, 89)

When we are exposed to the Word of God it *will* change us. It may not be comfortable, but, in the end we will be transformed to look more and more like Christ in our spiritual lives. This is discipleship!

Our staff has challenged us to be a committed disciple of Jesus Christ by engaging in three types of relationships in 2013 – Paul (being a mentor), Timothy (being mentored) and Barnabus (being an encourager). Many in our church body have already taken steps to begin forming those types of relationships. There have been some encouraging testimonies circulating that are arising from those relationships.

In the coming weeks, there will be more information about some purposeful opportunities our church will provide to encourage those relationships to form and grow in small group settings with some fantastic small group study materials to help facilitate those groups. Stay tuned for more information and begin praying in earnest about how God is seeking to grow you through this endeavor. The Deacons look forward to helping support this vital step of spiritual growth for our church! May our church be like the early disciples in Acts 17 so that the world will be compelled to testify, "these are the ones who have turned the world upside down!" (Acts 17:6)

Thunder in the Morning Calm by Don Brown: "Lieutenant Commander 'Gunner' MCormick is assigned as an intelligence officer to Carrier Strike Force 10, being deployed to the Yellow Sea at the invitation of South Korea for joint exercises with the US Navy. During his pre-deployment briefing, he discovers a TOP-SECRET MEMO revealing rumors that the North Koreans may still be holding a handful of elderly Americans from the Korean War in secret prison camps. A former Navy JAG officer and action officer in the Pentagon, Brown pens action-packed plots and finely-drawn characters that are credible and compelling. To that end, we are striving to align ourselves with God's Word and better understand what thinking Biblically is really about - especially in terms of education. Fine Arts News, Mrs. Shoran Potter: Grades second through Sixth are preparing for Sinfonietta which will take place on May 15th at 10:00 am in the Theater. Our Second grade students are learning to play the "Song Flute." Students study musical symbols, music notation, and rhythm. Our Third grade students are learning to play the "Flutophone." The Fourth grade students are learning to play the "Soprano Recorder." The Fifth and Sixth grade students have been studying Advanced Music Theory. These students may choose between the soprano, alto, or tenor "Recorders" for class. Grades Seventh and Eighth are studying Beginning Acting; Introduction to Theater. Our older students will study the history of theater and beginning acting. II Timothy 1:6 "Therefore I remind you to fan (stir up) the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands."

Archery Team, Mr. Pat Combs: According to George B. Eager, "the art of using the bow and arrow for hunting and in battle is of great antiquity." It is mentioned in Genesis 21:20, as well as in the Iliad and the Odyssey and depicted on Egyptian monuments and Assyrian sculptures. The Philistines excelled in the art, which led David to order that special training in it be given to the Hebrews, 2 Samuel 1:18. It was an important art throughout the word in Biblical times - Genesis 27:3, Isaiah 22:6, and Psalm 127:4. The bow was common to civil and military life and views with the spear in importance. It was usually made of tough, elastic, seasoned wood, and often mounted with bronze, in Psalm 18:34 and Job 20:24. But horn, too, was used for bows by the ancients, some with double curves being evidently modeled after the horns of oxen. The bow-string was commonly ox-gut and the arrows were of reed, or light wood tipped with flint, bronze, or iron. The battle bows, such as are mentioned in Zachariah 9:10 must have been of great size, since they required to be strung by pressing the foot on the lower end, while the upper end was bent down to receive the string into a notch; hence the expression "to tread (string) the bow." The arrows, "the sons of quiver," Lamentation 3:13, were ordinarily carried in the quiver, which was either placed on the back or slung on the left side, secured by a belt over the right shoulder.

<u>Physical Education, Mr. Shane Johnson:</u> Physical Education classes are on Thursdays for grades K-2 and on Fridays for grades 3-8. "Lord, teach my children perseverance in all they do, and help them especially to run their race with perseverance." Hebrews 12:1

<u>Technology Teacher, Melissa Levanduski:</u> We are so grateful for the computer lab that we have. Melissa Levanduski is working to create a syllabus for next school year so that we can use it as Specials for  $5^{th} - 8^{th}$  grade students. She is skilled in computer

usage and certified in numerous software programs. The students will be specifically learning typing skills, word processing, (Microsoft Word), and internet-based research skills. Along with these, Melissa will also be teaching basic computer usage and computer components. Our donated SmartBoard and HD digital projector has been installed. We also have a digital projector and speakers which have been set up on a mobile cart with laptop, which can be utilized through-out the school. It is namely for Art classes but may be used in other classrooms as needed. It can project onto white boards or a blank wall. A wonderful sound system has been installed as well so it can be used as a mini movie theater, if the need arises for showing educational videos.
