THIS WEEK'S SERMON

January 19, 2014 Sermon: What to Do With Them? Scripture: Mark 7:24-30

Theme: This week's sermon is a biblical reflection on a sensitive topic: racism, and its ugly cousin, prejudice. I give this week's sermon not as an enlightened prophet of justice. Rather, I speak humbly as a preacher who was taught relatively benign, though no less divisive, forms of racism growing up, and has spent his whole adult life trying to overcome it. Here in the heart of Texas, a state rich in a not-so-distant history of segregation, I'm guessing I preach to the choir. This week's sermon closes with what I believe is a stirring five-minute call to social justice put together by a Christian Theological Seminary media group. This is Sunday to meditate on the theological significance of Martin Luther King, Jr's. Christian Legacy.

Gospels, as a guide, the conversation inevitably turns to matters of daily living. No prestudy required. Simply come with Bible in hand and a willingness to engage the living Gospel. During the study we also take time to lift up prayer needs.

Also, among the workshop descriptions you will find many that you might want to encourage specific people to attend. For instance:

- b) Anyone contemplating starting a community-based outreach organization will find help in how to establish such. Young clergy in particular are very interested in detaching such from 'churchy' organizations. Bi-vocational or part-time ministers should also take a look at this, for the possibility of supplementing their income.
- c) Anyone struggling with the role of women in church leadership and ministry would benefit from Massey's workshops on this.
- d) Several workshops establish theological understanding of Outreach
- e) There are multiple workshops on specific outreach programs: Rowlett Reindeer, community gardens, Sunday morning outreach, community fellowship meals, Men's ministry, Women's ministry, disaster relief, special needs ministry are all workshop opportunities
- f) Those who are struggling with end-of-life issues (their own or a loved one) have workshop choices, as well as an update on Fowler Communities

All the church growth literature now is lifting up the central role ENGAGEMENT IN MISSION has in attracting new people to existing churches, and in even sparking fundamental transformation.
