


WELCOME!!!

MOMENTS REFLECTION

In his book, **The Greatest Generation Speaks** (113-14), Tom Brokaw, includes a story written about John Craven of McLean, Virginia. Craven was a military chaplain in four campaigns during WWII and three during the Korean



War. Portion of his letter ran in the April 6, 1995 Baptist periodical, *Religious Herald*.

"Traumatized by mortar fire, the young Marine huddled outside a military hospital, his body trembling, clenched into a fetal position. John took his hand and began to pray, "Our Father which art in heaven, hallowed be they name." The trembling continued. "Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven."

In a moment, the Marine composed himself enough to join the chaplain: "Give us this day our bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors."

The article continues: "As they finished the Lord's Prayer the soldier began to relax and the shaking subsided." Pam Parry who writes the article concludes with a remarkable observation by Chaplain Craven: "The most effective antidote for shell shock is the Lord's Prayer."

The next time life leaves you "shell shocked," may I suggest that you pray the Lord's Prayer?

THIS WEEK'S SERMON

June 1, 2014

Sermon: "The Places You Will Go"

Scripture: Acts 1:6-11

Synopsis: We were taking a family vacation to Disney World. For several weeks we'd carefully made plans so that when the glorious day of departure arrived, we could board the plane and relax—no work responsibilities to manage, no cares to consider. It was a memorable trip. But more than 15 years later and I still have a crystal clear memory of the older woman, a perfect stranger, who sidled up next to me while I waited for the kids to finish a ride, and over the next 30 minutes told me the anguished story of her life. I listened. Carefully attended. Gave compassion. And then in the blink of an eye she was gone. Never learned her name. I was in Disney World, taking a vacation. Left my "clerical collar at home." And yet, right there, in that precise moment, I was called to be a witness to a perfect stranger in need. It seems to happen this way in all our Christian lives. God of heaven sends us to the far corners of the world and there we have a word of faith to share.
