THIS WEEK'S SERMON

December 9, 2012 (Advent #2) Sermon: "Imagine That" Scripture: Luke 3:1-6

Synopsis: John not only dressed weird. He said weird things. Did you catch that part in his sermon about making preparations for God's arrival-a time, John says, when "every ditch will be filled in, every bump smoothed out . . . all the ruts paved over." (The Message). It sounds almost too good to be true. And you know what they say. If it sounds too good to be true it probably is. And yet, this seems to be Scripture's modus operandi: making outlandish promises and expecting us to believe them. You've heard me say that in addition to being an emotional experience, the Christian faith also needs to be an intellectual one. Our faith needs to be equal parts emotion and reason. This second Sunday in Advent, I want to add a third necessary aspect of Christian faith: imagination. Children seem to come by it naturally. We adults tend to live in more cynically flattened But unless we nurture a healthy sense of worlds. imagination, allow ourselves to picture more than the facts of our daily realities, we'll likely miss the good news of Jesus' Advent here.
