### THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Sermon: "Creator ex Nihilo: Fully Convinced" Scripture: Romans 4: 16-25 Synopsis: I know. This week's sermon title carries a bit of odd Latin wording. Creator ex nihilo. I don't know much Latin, but over the years of studying hope I've learned to

cherish the phrase because of the deep, sacred meaning which it conveys. God creates life out of nothing. That's what it means. God creates life out of nothing. As I go through life-remembering my own occasions of loss, remembering and sharing in the losses of those whom I have been called to serve, as I witness Christ's Church snatch life from the claws of death-I can't help but think that this is the essence of the Gospel: that God is at work in our lives making "death places" into "life places," despairing places into hopeful places. Abraham was confident in this conviction. Despite all signs to the contrary in his own life, Abraham showed us how faith is a confidence in the power of God to be Eternal Creator. On this Pentecost Sunday, it strikes me that the Pentecost moment described in the Book of Acts 2, is yet another illustration of God taking something, admittedly very little--a motely, fearful, self-doubting few (think Peter)—and by day's end fashioning them into Christ's Church
