As I write this, my 2016 ballot is open on my dining table. There are a lot of names, and a lot of issues, to be decided. One thing I'm convinced of, as I have come to know you, is that you and I may not fill in all the same blanks on the ballot, but we do trust that as we vote (on or before November 8!), we have our faith and our commitment to the common good in mind.

As always, the contests are not between perfect good and perfect evil, but between conflicting goods, with compromises that must be made on one side and on the other. Thus, our choices as we vote are moral choices, as we deal with moral dilemmas.

This year, *not* as always, some of the contests are marked by polarization, and by levels of meanness we have not seen in electoral politics in many of our lifetimes. This meanness is not only candidate-vs.-candidate, but also citizen-vs.citizen. That's not healthy.

Here are some things I try to remember when I vote. Heck, here are some things I try to remember *all* the time:

- each person is beloved of God, no matter what their party alignment, no matter what their record or reputation, no matter what;
- the greatest good for the greatest number is important; so is reaching toward that good while treating the most vulnerable with justice and respect;
- my own rights and my own benefit are not as important as these.

Here's another thing I try to remember: On the morning of November 9, and on January 20, we will still be partners in this twofold enterprise, membership together in the body of Christ in Tracyton & Brownsville, and citizenship together in this nation we love and yearn to improve. And together, with our diverse stories and diverse views, we have the responsibility to continue to work together, and debate together, seeking the greatest good, and each person's safety and respect.
