Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, and Joyous Epiphany!

I can hardly believe it! December marked our fourth Christmastide together! That means that we have been through the three-year lectionary cycle together, and have celebrated almost every major Christian festival together—almost. Only one remains: Epiphany.

Usually, the Epiphany of Our Lord falls on a weekday, and the following Sunday is the celebration of the Baptism of Our Lord. In fact, the last time Epiphany fell on a Sunday, it was in 2013, which was before my time at Faith. I'm looking forward to celebrating it with you this year in Worship on January 6th!

Be sure you don't miss it! The next time Epiphany falls on a Sunday is in 2030!

Epiphany is a celebration that the light of God is shown forth in Jesus Christ. Jesus, born of the virgin Mary, is truly the Son of God. During Epiphany, we recall how the wise men, led by a star, brought gifts of Frankincense, gold, and myrrh to worship the toddler King. They recognized that this was the long-awaited Messiah. Spotlight on Mt. Healthy Alliance Food Pantry

Since its inception in 2007, Faith Lutheran Church has supported this all-volunteer food pantry with financial support, donations and volunteer effort. You've undoubtedly seen the colorful shopping bags in the Narthex, read the appeals for donations of personal care products and participated in the annual "Souper Bowl" spare change collection. Here are some things you may not know.

Did you know? Mt Healthy Alliance - Food Pantry

Is a 501 © (3) nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation and a member agency of the Freestore Foodbank.

Is supported by ten other churches in the 45231 zip code area.

Is an all-volunteer choice pantry - the director and assistant are unpaid and each donate over 200 hours on-site each month!

Relies on additional volunteers (typically 80/month) to pick up donations from the Freestore and Freestore partners, unload trucks, screen and stock donations, and assist guests during shopping hours.

Serves over 400 low-income families in the 45231 zip code are served area each month with Christian love. No one is turned away. One-time emergency assistance is provided to those outside 45231.

Provides three days of food to those who qualify once per month

Also provides metro bus tickets for transportation to jobs, medical appointments or school, blood pressure checks on 3rd Tuesday evening of the month and makes referrals to other agencies for help with clothing, household items, and financial assistance.

The pantry helps families like Ms. Thompson who lives on a disability check and struggles to pay for necessities. Or the Jones family, who with two working adults still struggle to provide food and necessities for their six children. In addition, the pantry has provided "angel wings" to several clients. By volunteering at the pantry, they gained the self- confidence to find employment and fulfillment.

Kathy Lorenz, the pantry director, has said that being responsible for providing services for over 400 families a month is a significant and ongoing challenge. Some food items are obtained from the Freestore Foodbank using Freestore credits, others are donated from Freestore partners Kroger & Walmart and others are purchased only when absolutely necessary from retail outlets. As Kathy said, "When you add in all the in-kind donations and support from schools and individuals we are able to survive."

How you can help

Help stock the pantry - Tuesdays, Wednesdays & Fridays from 9-11 AM. Unload donations, stock shelves, shelves, sort fresh bread and produce and have fun doing it!

Help clients during operating hours - Mondays 11 AM-1 PM; Tuesdays 5-7 PM; Thursdays & Saturdays 9 AM -12 PM. Help clients select food & personal care items, bag and/or carry shopping bags to cars. Arrive 15 minutes early for instructions.

Make a Donation - Fill a colorful shopping bag with items & return to Narthex to be delivered to the pantry. The pantry is always in need of following items: deodorant, shampoo, bar soap, toilet paper, tooth paste, tooth brushes, canned fruit, cereal and peanut Butter.

The pantry is located in the basement of the Mt. Healthy Christian Church at 7717 Harrison Avenue. Entrance on Hill Avenue.
