
FAMILY MATTERS by John Keeny

GENERAL CONFERENCE BRIEFING, MAY 1 AND 29

The quadrennial United Methodist General Conference is May 10-20, in Portland, Oregon. This meeting sets Church policy and social principles. Among the critical concerns to be addressed are changing the Church's stance on the ordination and marriage of LGBT persons. King Avenue is blessed to have two of the 16 West Ohio Conference delegates, Phil Moots and Bill Brownson. They will conduct a pre-conference briefing on the legislation on Sunday, May 1, 10am, in the chapel. After General Conference, they will conduct a post-conference briefing on Sunday, May 29, 10am.





The eighth annual Cuisine For A Cause is in the books, and we had another successful event this year. As a result of your generosity, we will be sending over \$19,000 to our brothers and sisters in Piedras Negras. The children and staff of Casa de Misericordia thank everyone who attended, who made a donation, or who volunteered to help make the event a success. We couldn't have done it without you!

Casa de Misericordia has been home to about 300 children since opening in 2005, but they have never received financial support from any government agency. Instead, they depend entirely on the generosity of congregations and individuals in the United States and Mexico. There are a handful of people in the San Antonio area that have been very faithful to the orphanage, providing monetary and in-kind support and personal assistance to the casa. But the majority of the money needed to run the ministry comes from central Ohio, and Cuisine For A Cause is the single biggest fundraiser. You, collectively, have provided for food and shelter and clothing and doctors and an education to care for the children for 3 months. Congratulations, and thank you!

\overline{NNEMAP} by Anne Nelson

Our new location on East 11th Avenue has afforded NNEMAP the opportunity to serve more and diverse clients.

March continued the growth in services with 1031 visits and 2809 people served. That represented a 24% and 46% increase over last year. YTD the numbers are similar with a 28% increase in visits and 44% increase in members served. Zip codes 43219 and 43224 have been similar and almost as large as 43215. Zip code 43211 accounts for 60% of our clients.

Stonybrook UMC donated money that will allow us to move forward with our larger delivery door so we can plan for our produce mart to be held in the early evening (after working hours for most people) and Saturday morning. This will allow working folks to come volunteer at the pantry. Stay tuned for more details

Mt. Carmel Mobile Medical Van starts a twice monthly visit to NNEMAP in May. The van will be staffed by several nurses and clinical staff to meet the health needs of our clients. Our services continue to grow as a result of our move. Getting ask to leave our home of 38 years turns out to be a blessing!

Our pantry stock needs are cereal, diapers in all sizes and baby food, tooth brushes and tooth paste, cat and dog food and bags of sugar, flour and detergent. We also need containers with screw tops. We have plenty of plastic containers right now.
