



Exploring the Journey and Responding to Our Call Adult Class


Wednesday evenings 7-8:30 September 11 – November 21. Trecia Holdren and Roger Blocher will lead this class.






ultimately prevailed. This program will also provide an overview of gender development, creating gender-inclusive environments, and practical resources for family and friends of transgender individuals.

RETIREES MINISTRY


Trip to Seminary Hill Farm, MTSO - Tuesday, September 17th
