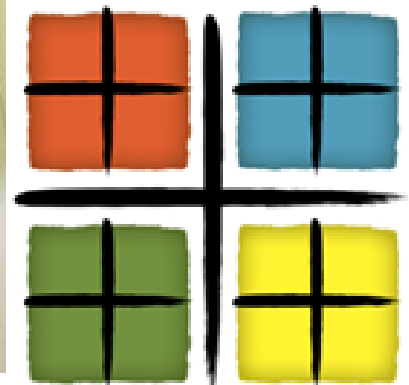

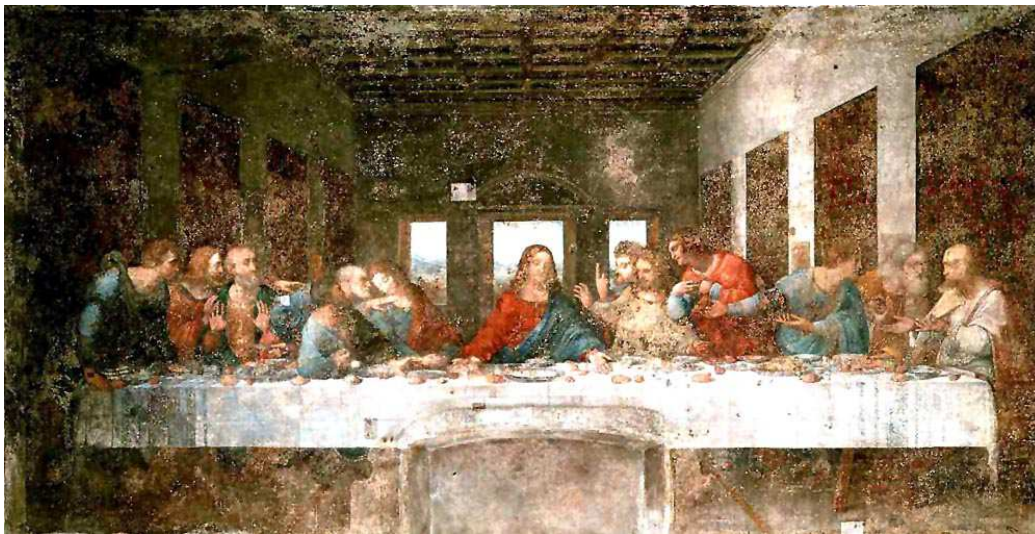

And the need to protect our Central Ohio youth is critical. **Within the state of Ohio, one of the highest rates of new HIV infections is youth ages 13 - 24.**

Getting the word out that HIV still exists and there is assistance for those infected and affected by, or at risk of HIV/AIDS is the Walk's biggest goal. Our best chance to spread the word is through teamwork.

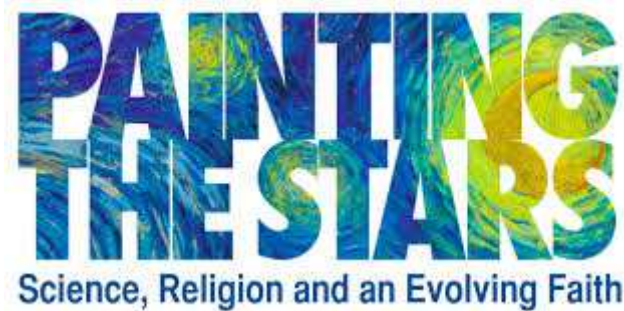

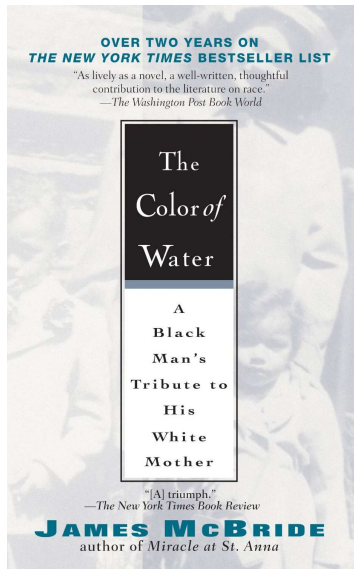
