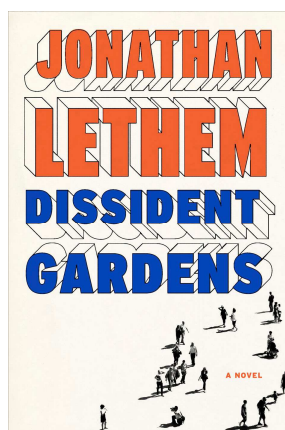

NEW COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP TAKES OFF! by Colleen Ogle

Is there a better way to connect to the needs and potential of a neighborhood than through its public schools? Is there any more important investment to be made than in the children of the community? The Hubbard Mastery School, located just one mile from King Avenue's doors, is a newly-opened elementary school in the Columbus City Schools (CCS) system. Susan McGeean, the principal of the 330-student school, is eagerly reaching out to the community for partners to support the children's education and King Avenue UMC is stepping up to join the cause! One need the school has is for Reading Buddies, adults trained to read one-on-one with children using techniques that encourage good reading practices. Our first partnership venture, a Reading Buddies training held at King Avenue on Sunday, September 21, got off to a great start. Over forty volunteers from KAUMC, including 12 OSU students from the Circle K organization, received Reading Buddies training that day and will begin partner reading at Hubbard Mastery School in October.

If you want to deepen KAUMC's partnership with Hubbard Mastery School here are some options...

- We will be hosting a Staff Appreciation Lunch—Monday, October 27th. You could help cook or serve the meal!
- During the month of November, the school will welcome many guests into the building to help students develop dreams for their futures. They will observe a College Awareness Week, Military Awareness Week, and have a "Career Fair." If you have an interesting career or have served in the military, you could talk to the children about it!
- We still need Reading Buddies—the CCS has trainings coming up on Mondays, September 29 or October 6 from 4-5 pm.

An opportunity to be paired with another Christian who has been trained to listen, love, care and build a relationship through confidential sharing and prayer.

Who is it for?

A Prayer Partner is for people who are experiencing life changes, stresses or difficult seasons in their lives. It is also for people who may need experience in being spiritually connected and wholly authentic in relationships. Whether you have experienced a loss, or just are missing a deeper friendship, our prayer partners will meet you where you are.

How does it help?

God created us to be in community and to connect at a deep level. Each prayer partner is committed to walking with you through whatever you are experiencing and praying for you regularly. Primarily we will be present for you and listen, but will also have resources to share new ways for you to experience and hear from God and feel His presence with you.



How would we meet?

In order to be available to people in a variety of ways, our caring would be tailored to what works best for your schedule and availability. Everyone will meet in person for the first meeting, but after that you can continue to meet face to face or do a combination of phone or email interactions. Typically you would have some type of contact with your partner once per week.

What we are not

We are not professionally trained counselors. Prayer Partners are spiritual companions, willing to walk with others through challenging times with a shared faith in God.

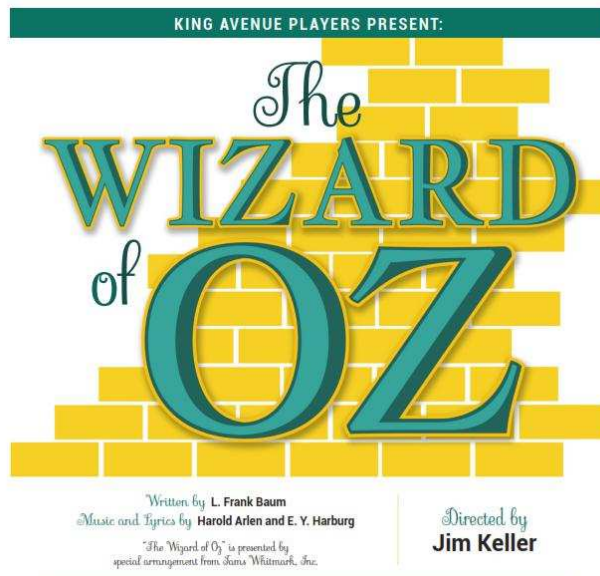

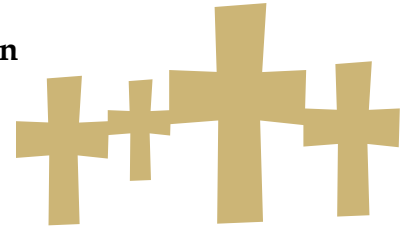

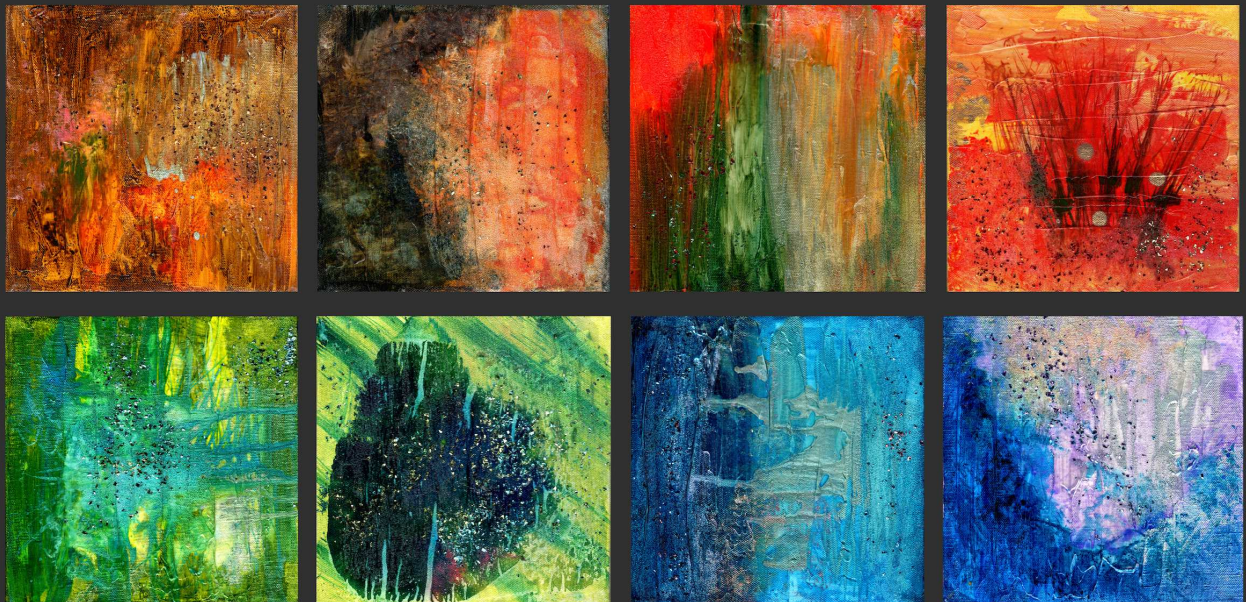


The Death of Glitter Art Class
