

Hands-On Mission Class

Intergenerational—all ages welcome! This is a class for people who like to combine thinking with doing good in community with others. Part of the class time will include simple Lenten devotionals while the remainder will involve hands-on preparations for King Avenue's Community Easter Egg Hunt, which will be an outreach activity to the community in partnership with Hubbard Mastery School. Led by April Olt and team, in the AWE Room.

Lenten Study

Led by Colleen Ogle; based on the book *Forgiveness* by Marjorie Thompson. Forgiving others and humbly asking for forgiveness are central disciplines for all Christian believers. Lent, a time to reflect on our Christian journey, is an appropriate time to deepen our understanding and practice of forgiveness. Marjorie J. Thompson, author of the best-selling book *Soul Feast*, takes a close look at our understanding of forgiveness in this encouraging study. In six brief chapters, Thompson addresses such questions as the following:

- Is forgiveness a Christian duty under all circumstances? Or are there situations Christians do not need to forgive?
- Is forgiveness a matter between individuals, or is it meaningful only in the context of communities?
- Is forgiving the best route to healing for the injured?
- How do we get past emotional barriers to real forgiveness?

This study will combine Bible study of key passages that yield insights about the nature of forgiveness, God's and ours, with small group discussion and individual reflection. The class will meet in the Fireside Room.

OHIO MISSIONARY TO CASA DE MISERICORDIA by Scott Vaughan

The Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church has approved a missionary on-site at Casa de Misericordia. Laurel LaFrance from Marysville First UMC will start her two-year assignment on March 21, 2015. Laurel traveled twice to the orphanage as part of a mission team and immediately fell in love with the children and is a strong believer in the mission and ministry of the casa. She is a Spanish teacher by training and resigned her position with the Marysville schools last summer to begin this journey. Everyone associated with Casa de Misericordia expects Laurel to be a tremendous asset with the children, in general by helping to manage the daily needs of 32 traumatized children (including a half-dozen age four and under) and specifically by helping with homework and starting instruction in English.






