






Our school is doing an excellent job teaching my child.




The Spanish program is beneficial.




The Physical Education Class meets my child's needs.








The Accelerated Reading Program is a good investment.




Teachers hold high expectations for student learning.




Teachers communicate well with parents.




















Teachers and administrators at our school demonstrate genuine concern for the well being of students.




Students at our school demonstrate genuine concern for the well being of fellow students.










Extended care programming and the staff meet my child's needs.




Effective procedures are in place for me to effectively communicate with my child's teacher.




The receptionists are friendly and perform their duties well.




Our school's facilities are clean and well-maintained.












The Speech program is beneficial.




I like the daytime format of this year's science fair.
