The Autumn Gala is likely to be an annual event, adding to a growing list of Mount Carmel traditions. Photos by Mount News Team





Best dishes from Mrs. Oakes

5 cups all-purpose flour

Buttery Biscuits

2 cups all-purpose flour3 tsp. baking powder1 tsp. salt1 cup cold butter1 cup (8 oz.) sour cream

Combine flour, salt, and baking powder in a bowl.
Cut in butter. Stir in sour cream. Drop by rounded tablespoons into ungreased mini muffin cups. Bake at 450 degrees for 11-15 minutes.

Angel Biscuits

3 tsp. baking powder 3 tbsp. sugar 1 tsp. salt 1 tsp. soda 3/4 cups shortening 2 cups buttermilk 1 pkg. yeast

Sift flour, baking powder, sugar, salt and soda in a bowl. Cut in shortening.

Dissolve yeast in 1/2 cup lukewarm water. Add to flour mixture. Add buttermilk. Work together with a large spoon until all flour is moistened.

Cover bowl. Refrigerate overnight. Roll out biscuits. Bake at 400 degrees for 12 minutes.

Pumpkin Cookies

1 can pumpkin
1 yellow cake mix
1 tsp. vanilla
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1/2 tsp. ginger
1/4 tsp. cloves

Mix all ingredients together. Drop out spoonfuls on cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-15 minutes.

Let cool completely. Top with cream cheese icing.



Mount Carmel teacher Teresa
Cowan and husband, former Mount
Carmel teacher Jim Cowan, viewed
the northern lights at the Mount
Carmel Campus on Wades Mill
Road Oct. 10. The northern lights,
also known as aurora borealis,
occur when charged particles from
the sun interact with the Earth's
magnetic field and atmosphere. The
lights are not typically visible in
Kentucky, but a geomagnetic storm
in October allowed Americans to
view them as far south as the
