#### **Staffing Changes:**

CCS employs over fifty individuals; our retention rate has historically stood at 95%. Most faculty members have signed contracts and recommitted to another year. A few folks will not be returning. Ashley Thomas anchored our middle school math department; she and her husband are expecting a little girl in July. Under her leadership, our students grabbed more ACSI Math Olympic awards than in any previous year. Karis Pumphrey, a Wright State/Ohio University graduate has been hired. Mrs. Pumphrey is currently teaching a class at BCTC. The Pumphreys have two daughters who both attend CCS. Nine-year employee <u>Lacy Heathman</u> will be exploring other opportunities this fall. <u>Michelle Nunn</u> has been hired to fill her shoes. Mrs. Nunn is a Western Kentucky graduate with an Elementary Ed degree. Mrs. Tracy Moore Todd is pregnant and due in December; this six-year employee was evaluating her options but a recent medical diagnosis determined her direction. With a high risk pregnancy and an earlier delivery date, she decided not to return. <u>Rachel Colebank</u> has been hired to handle her duties. Mrs. Colebank is an experienced educator having taught first grade for five years. From 2007-2013, Rachel was the Children's Director here at Calvary Christian Church. This past year, <u>Mr. Gordon Smith</u> shared one of his life passions-American history. Gordon taught the 8th grade history component. With his duties as campus pastor at Mt. Carmel increasing, he will no longer be available; Mrs. Karen Witt will handle all MS history classes. The Physical Education Department has yearned for some stability over the past six years. Mr. Greg Sibley assumed a temporary role last spring. The school has hired Mr. Sibley; he brings hope for longevity and program development. Please welcome all of these folks.

At this moment, one position remains undecided. <u>Nealy Walton</u> (3rd) has requested additional time to weigh her options. With her numerous CCS contributions, she deserves some extra time. When Nealy relays her decision, her parents/students will be contacted. Believe me, a line of qualified and experienced educators have already interviewed for this potential opening.
