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Medical Missionary Finds Healing and Hope

Dr. Cynthia Calla, a missionary medical doctor, was evacuated from Cambodia during a coup in 1997. MRI sent a counselor to Bangkok to assist in debriefing her and 24 other missionaries. After the debriefing week, MRI continued to minister to Dr. Calla in the US. We gave her, in her words, "space and grace." She not only received healing from the trauma but was able to deal with the burnout she was experiencing in her life. Dr. Calla, twenty years later, is now working with AIDS patients in Africa and thriving. She recently wrote the following to us, *"I think that perseverance in ministry is a great need among ministers in this day and time when the world around us seems to be going crazy and people are losing their moorings. So many missionaries and pastors I know have quit the ministry. In my walk, your ministry helped me to persevere after Cambodia when I wanted to resign; you saved my missionary career."*
