I saw this title on a shelf of a Christian bookstore, "Developing Your Spiritual Muscles". Wait a minute, I didn't know we had such things. Isn't Jesus supposed to be our strength? We ourselves do not ever become strong. Spiritual strength is not analogous to physical strength.

It isn't that it's not good to be strong in personality or in body. Our problem is not strength or weakness, it is self- dependence. I believe God's Word to us is this; bring your strengths to Jesus, give them up to Him. He can do wonderful things with strong people who are totally dependent upon Him. Bring your weakness to Jesus, give it up to Him; He can do wonderful things with weak people who are totally dependent upon Him.
