



Brief Beliefs:

To Illustrate:

In the frigid waters around Greenland are countless icebergs, some little and some gigantic. If you'd observe them carefully, you'd notice that sometimes the small ice floes move in one direction while their massive counterparts flow in another. The explanation is simple. Surface winds drive the little ones, whereas the huge masses of ice are carried along by deep ocean currents. Q – In a conversation with our neighbor, he shared that he prays for the dead. Does God give anyone a chance to believe after death? (Luke 16:19-31)

A — The unrepeatable reality of physical death leads directly to reaping what we sowed in this world. Jesus taught that in this parable of the rich man and Lazarus as well as when he spoke of dying in one's sins as something dreadful (John 8:21-23). Similarly, Paul taught that on judgment day, all will receive a destiny corresponding to their works (Romans 2:5-16; Galatians 6:7-8; Second Corinthians 5:10). New Testament teaching is unified in viewing the dead and final judgment this way. And scripture says nothing of God's grace triggering postmortem conversions. Thus we may infer that an unbeliever's lack of desire for Christ before the grave remains unchanged after the grave. God's offer of salvation does not extend beyond death. Excerpted from the *Quest Study Bible*.

At our Congregational meeting we will be voting on how we will proceed with building the addition. The recommendation of the elder board is to take out a construction loan for the amount of the pledges and begin the process right away. If we approve the recommendation, this is the process that will take place:



- 1. We will obtain architectural drawings
- 2. We will pursue these three at the same time:
 - I. Building permit
 - II. Update the bids
 - III. Procure a loan
- 3. Begin building.

Building Vision

Our 20/20 Vision goal was \$600,000.00 in pledges to build an education annex. As this Communiqué goes to print we have 94 pledges for \$607,219.00. Praise the Lord, and thanks to everyone at CCBC for working together to exceed the goal. A special thanks to the committee members who worked so hard to educate us all, answer questions and make the process as smooth as possible. It started in 2015 with a space utilization survey that confirmed the need for more classroom space for King's Kids, Youth, AWANA, MOPS, and LIFE Groups so that we have the space needed to make disciple makers.

In 2016, we had a feasibility study that confirmed the need and ministry objectives, but suggested we might not be able to afford a \$600,000.00 project. In 2017, we formed a 20/20 Vision Campaign Committee to educate members on the need and ask for pledges. Most members and regular attenders met with committee members in small groups to discuss the project. Over 100 attended the Main event where we learned more about the history of CCBC as well as the vision for the future. All heard the 20/20 Vision sermon series.

Today we have pledges exceeding the \$600,000.00 goal. Tonight, the congregation will vote on the project. Then we can begin to fulfill our initial pledges as we look forward to seeing how the Lord will bless us in the next three years and use the new facility to continue to make disciple makers.
