

## **India Mission Trip Russ Adams**

#### **Being There**

Commenting on the distractions in his day, Oswald Chambers wrote, "the world clamors for the death of Jesus". Perhaps since the day the crowd shouted "Crucify him!" it has always been so. Certainly, today as the news urgently relays the issues, or we worry about things at work, or are encouraged to buy the latest iPhone, the world clamors for us to put to death the Son of Man by granting Him scant attention. Participating in a short-term mission silences those voices in ways few other things can.

Whether we find ourselves in a penitentiary, a hotel room in Poland, an Indian village or the Rescue Mission, few things focus our minds on what is important more certainly than entering into an environment that is foreign to us and investing in the lives of those who dwell there. It is a moment in time when by ministering to others we are forced to contemplate the depth and power of the Gospel to reconcile, free and heal to the uttermost. It is also an opportunity to reflect on those times where, by the power of the Holy Spirit, our lives too have been changed.

We have often heard that "you can't out give God" in connection to money but that is only the most trivial arena where that truth applies. We cannot out serve, out sacrifice or out love Him either. In all this there is an odd symmetry. By going to these places, our presence creates at least one question that stills the daily storms that prevent the lost from seeing Jesus: Why have you come to show love to us, leaving all that you have and hold dear for a season? The only answer must ever and always be "because He first loved us."

### Brief Beliefs

#### **Brief Beliefs:**

We believe God created an order of spiritual beings called angels to serve Him and do His will (Psalm 148:1-5; Colossians 1:16). The holy angels are obedient spirits ministering to the heirs of salvation and glorifying God (Hebrews 1:6-7, 13-14). Certain angels, called demons, Satan being their chief, through deliberate choice revolted and fell from their exalted position (Revelation 12:7-9). They now tempt individuals to rebel against God (First Timothy 4:1; First Peter 5:8). Their destiny in hell has been sealed by Christ's victory over sin and death (Hebrews 2:14; Revelation 20:10). \*Taken from our North American Baptist Statement of Faith.

#### **To Illustrate:**

Our English word "angel" actually comes from the word for "messenger" in Greek (angelos) and, in a very literal sense, angels are messengers. God sends them to protect his followers and to help us this side of heaven whether we see them, acknowledge them or not. After Jesus was tempted in the wilderness, angels were there to minister to Him (likely in this case supplying him with food following his 40 days of fasting, perhaps similar to what they did for Elijah). There are many stories in the Bible of angels ministering to God's people and, if you want to read of more recent documented occurrences, I have a couple of books on my shelf that I know would be of great encouragement to you. Just ask me if you'd like to borrow them. - Pastor Gordon

#### **Honest Questions/Answers:**

**Q** – Does God allow pain in order to display his power? This question comes from John 9:1-3 when Jesus and his disciples saw a blind man from birth. His disciples asked him "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"



A – This is a great question for those of us who have been going through different yet still difficult family health issues, sharing similar discouragement and questions of "Why?" that tag along. In a sense, yes, God does allow pain in order to display his power. But throughout the Bible we see God's purpose and intent contrasted with the work of Satan. Satan kills, steals and destroys in so many realms of life, including peace and order in relationships and with our emotional and physical well being. In contrast Jesus gives abundant life (John 10:10). In fact, Jesus came to destroy the devil's work (I John 3:8). The evil that God may permit Satan to inflict, as with Job, and the pain and suffering caused by our own sin somehow figures into the sovereign purpose and plan of God. Some of the bad things that happen occur simply because we live in a fallen world. Negative circumstances occur because the entire creation (including humanity) was affected when sin entered the world, opening the door for illness, natural disasters as well as the effects of humanity's personal bad choices. In this passage of I John 3:1-3 though, neither the man nor his parents had done anything to deserve the man's blindness from birth. Their suffering came as a consequence of living in a world plagued by sin. Nevertheless, God intended to use their terrible experience to display God's work in this man's life. God receives glory when he miraculously intervenes with his healing power. But he also receives glory when people endure their own suffering through the power of his grace.

#### **Bridges of Love (Formerly Love INC.) Breakfast**



Pastor Gordie, and our church Ministry Assistants Tami and Melissa were invited to get connected with Bridges of Love and munch on breakfast in the process. One morning the three of us set out to go to the "network breakfast". It was a small group of about 25 individuals, some from local churches and some from inside the organization itself, including the Executive Director Sherry Phinisey, Clearinghouse Director, Sara Birmingham and the Director of Jobs for Life, Sheila Bernard. Each spoke in front of the group and delivered personal stories

of the needs and successes of their ministry.


We learned about the call screening process to determine their ability to meet a need, whether they need to provide a reference (as in the need for addiction counseling), provide a service through local churches (such as yard work for an elderly family) or financial assistance. Bridges of Love uses a data-tracking system to discourage abusers of "the system" and to track our community's ongoing needs. It was through this data-tracking that Bridges of Love (then, Love INC) realized the need for a way to help those families caught in a cycle of defeat and began the Jobs for Life ministry. Jobs for Life is a 16-week program that helps individuals start a new cycle, teaching from the Bible while educating on practical life issues of job interviews, filling out resumes and what things are preventing an individual from landing a job. Although their ministry particularly deals with the "working poor", helping them get back on their feet, they will also field calls and provide referrals for those seeking help on issues of homelessness, addiction or mental illness.

Unanimously, the workers at Bridges of Love agreed that one of the things they enjoy most is seeing God work in real ways, helping people get back on their feet through the connections of local churches. Bridges of Love works as a clearing house to refer people in need to a resource to help them, and so a big part of fulfilling their ministry comes from local churches like ours. Some needs that they mentioned were:


- Teams of people to volunteer for odd jobs or lawn & yard care
- Volunteer childcare workers for their very important Jobs for Life ministry
- Mentors for their Jobs for Life ministry
- Food prepared for Jobs for Life weekly classes (about 23 people)
- Periodic donations of clothing for children and teens, or money towards their overall ministry


