Brief Beliefs

Pastor Gordie Bauslaugh

Brief Beliefs:

We believe religious liberty, rooted in Scripture, is the inalienable right of all individuals to freedom of conscience with ultimate accountability to God (Genesis 1:27; John 8:32; Second Corinthians 3:17; Romans 8:21; Acts 5:29). Church and state exist by the will of God. Each has distinctive concerns and responsibilities, free from control by the other (Matthew 22:21). Christians should pray for civil leaders, and obey and support government in matters not contrary to Scripture (First Timothy 2:1-4; Romans 13:1-7; First Peter 2:13-16). The state should guarantee religious liberty to all persons and groups regardless of their religious preferences, consistent with the common good. *Taken from our *North American Baptist Statement of Beliefs*.

To Illustrate:

The word "inalienable" is used above, along with the reference of Genesis 1:27 following it. This is the truth communicated: that "God created man in his own image". This overrides any civil laws that nations make. Inalienable rights are natural rights that all human beings have, throughout the world, given by God. These inalienable rights are to be found in every nation, as all humanity is created in God's image. The sad statement is that some nations' leaders believe they have final authority even over the Creator God. Thus, all kinds of confusion and corruption in people's minds exists in the world today. But God keeps the final scorecard whether people realize this or not. Now I encourage you to take a moment, like I just did, and read the passages listed above in parentheses, along with the mentioned Genesis 1:27 passage.

Q – Second Peter 2:9 refers to God holding the unrighteous for the day of judgment, while continuing their punishment. So, how are the unrighteous being continually punished?

A – The Quest Study Bible suggests that this speaks of the certainty of judgment that will come upon those who do not repent. But it also suggests that until the time of that judgment, the wicked still face the consequences for their sin. Those living in sinful lifestyles cause themselves pain and destruction in this life as well as the next.

In our church lobby you will find a wooden box where you may place Bible or Daily Christian Living questions.

Coming Soon to CCBC:

Part of the job description of your Elder group is to watch over and care for the flock (congregation). One way we can care for the congregation is to ensure their safety while at the Church. Knowing that a few church attendees have had heart instances in the recent past and looking at the overall benefits of an AED (automated external defibrillator), the Elders agreed to purchase this in case someone has a heart related incident while at CCBC.

See the below list of benefits to having an AED:

- Onsite AEDs save precious treatment time, and can improve survival odds because they can be used before emergency medical service (EMS) personnel arrive.
- A heart rhythm in ventricular fibrillation may only be restored to normal by an electric shock.
- The AED is compact, lightweight, portable, battery operated, safe, and easy to use.
- Modern AEDs won't allow you to shock a victim that has a heartbeat, reducing the risk of doing more harm and reasons for people not to step in and help.
- These devices have a proven track record of helping to save lives in public places as well as in the workplace.
- Placing automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in the workplace, along with providing a proper management system and training for employees on how to use the devices, can mean the difference between life and death.
- Of the sudden cardiac arrest deaths that occur each year, more than 95 percent of the victims die before they reach the hospital.
- When care is provided within five to seven minutes, including early treatment with an AED, survival rates can improve dramatically.
- Using a defibrillator on an individual in cardiac arrest increases his survival rate by 60 percent, according to Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

Note: If no one that is certified is readily available to assist someone that is unresponsive, you are allowed to administer CPR or use the AED device.
