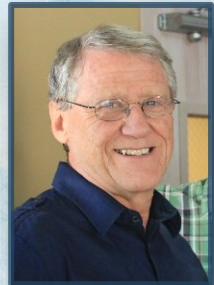

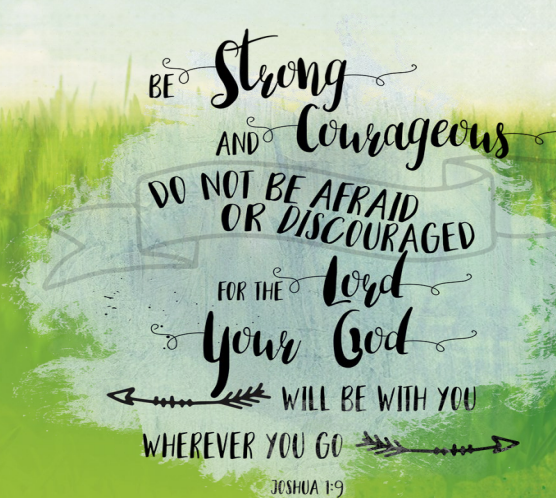

Brief Beliefs

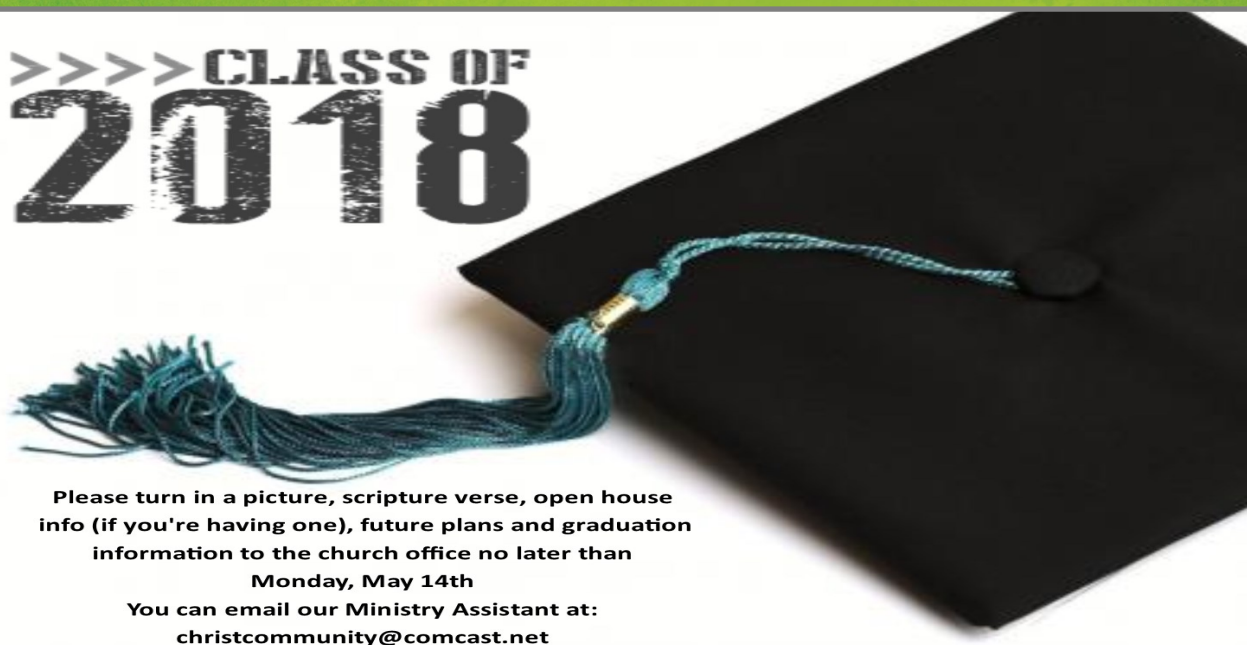

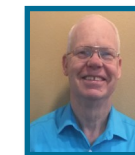
FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

General Fund Balance: \$12,031.70



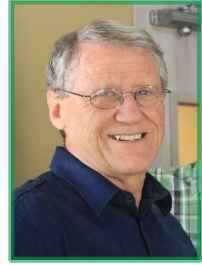

Q – Philippians 4:8 gives us different categories of those things we should be thinking about, those “lovely things”. So, how can we think “lovely thoughts”?

A – Paul is not talking about fleeting impressions that invade our thinking. Thoughts of temptation or discouragement can come unannounced. But we can discipline ourselves, making conscious choices to contemplate good things. Reading uplifting Bible verses, for example, listening to Christian music, listing God’s attributes, or keeping a list of “thank-you’s” to God are examples of ways we can get on the right track .

In our church lobby you will find a wooden box where you may place Bible or Daily Christian Living questions.

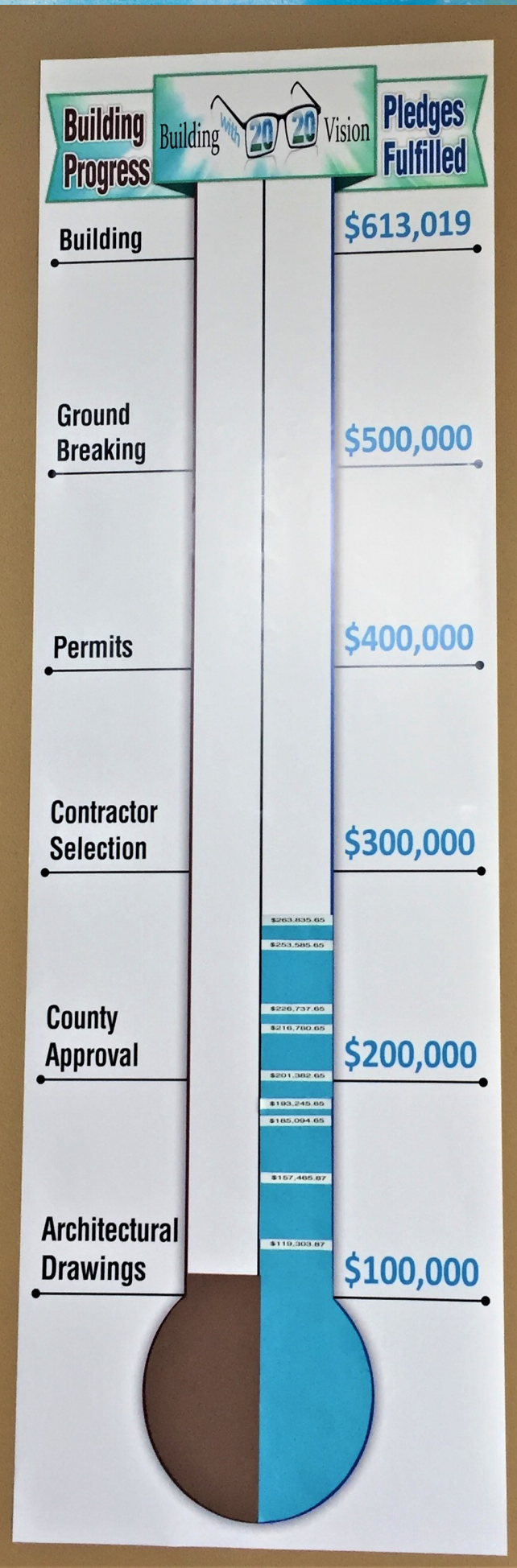

Tell us a bit about the leadership of your group and teaching methods.

Russ deemed us using a Socratic method. “*The Socratic method, also can be known as maieutic, method of elenchus, elentic method, or Socratic debate, is a form of cooperative argumentative dialogue between individuals, based on asking and answering questions to stimulate critical thinking and to draw out ideas and underlying presumptions*” (thanks Wikipedia). The teaching leader forms the basic lesson, but relies

heavily on our input. We all need to study, and there are lots of insightful comments and observations. Everyone participates. It is great! Our leadership was formed out of the desire to keep our LIFE Group intact. No one individual stepped up to do this, so we have a team of 4 primary and 2 backup individuals. Tom Thompson, Russ Adams and John Mills are the primary teachers with a very capable Otis Myers ready to step in at a moments notice. Jackie Reynolds handles administration and Debbie Bledsoe prayer requests.

What basically are the employments of your LIFE Group?

Military, retirees, business people, school counselors and domestic engineers.

Are you originally from Washington State?

Tell us about the make-up of your group and how your group has recently been applying the “one-anothers” of the Bible.

Most of the group serves in other ministries: worship, committee chairs, counting offerings, AWANA, nursery leaders, children's teachers and Bible study leaders. We range from retirees to young adults with small children. We support each other in prayer, meals and whatever is needed. Our latest innovation is using a face time app to have the Roods join us on Sunday mornings to participate in LIFE Group while dealing with very challenging health issues. Former LIFE Group members now live in Michigan, Nevada, Oregon and Texas and are still in contact with our group.
