




**Q** - With James 4:13 – 15 in mind, which says, "Now listen, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money.' Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that." - So, is it wrong to plan ahead???

**A** - No. In fact, the Bible encourages us to prepare carefully for the future (Proverbs 14:15 & 16:3). But, we should not become presumptuous in our plans as our plans can quickly ignore God's best desires for us. One example we all share is when we began our journey through all the books of the Bible during Sunday morning services. When we began in January 2013 we had no idea how many weeks, months and years this would take. We made plans but let the Holy Spirit lead us. There have been many holiday themes, A "Building With 20/20 Vision" series and Mission team reports that were woven into the original planned schedule. Here we are nearly 6 years later arriving at The Book of Revelation. James reminds us that the sovereign God of all will eventually prove He has the final say in all matters of our lives.
