





Honest Questions/Answers:

Q – In light of Matthew 7:1-5, is it really wrong for us to judge others?

 \mathbf{A} — In Matthew, chapters 5 — 7, Jesus warns his disciples against following the practices of the Pharisees, who judged others as if they themselves were beyond judgment. On top of that, they judged people by the letter, not the spirit of the law.

Jesus basically is saying that if we judge others this way, we will be judged likewise. This intent comes out in his metaphor of specks and planks (Matthew 7:3-5). We all have planks in our eyes, so to speak; to judge people for the little specks stuck in their eyes while we have big planks in our own is self-centered arrogance.

Those with planks in their eyes can't see clearly. They are dangerously low in discernment. With this in mind we must view others humbly. Church leaders must also be humble in making the difficult decisions for the church. All have a moral responsibility to judge the behavior of others – but only if we are humbly aware that we will sometimes be dead wrong and never totally right. We must remember that our ability to judge is limited and that we are sinful people who will ourselves be judged one day.

Electronic Giving is now available through **tithe.ly**.

It can be accessed through the CCBC web page.

Go to http://www.christcommunitybaptist.org/ and click on the on-line giving tab. On your smart phone go to the App store, search for tithely, and make sure-you are linked to CCBC. You can give by credit card, debit card, or directly from a bank account. Credit or debit transactions include a fee of about 3% (\$103.30 nets \$100.00) and are deposited in the church checking account in about two days. Bank account transactions include a fee of just over 1% and take 7 to 9 days to be deposited. You can select general fund or building fund. If you currently give with a check, please continue to do so (no fees) or pick the option in tithe.ly to cover the fees.

You can also use Bill Pay in your on-line checking account to give to the Church without a fee.

Worship Ministry Update

Mission Statement:

"The worship ministry exists to lead God's people at CCBC in times of corporate worship during our gatherings that will inspire acts of personal worship throughout the week. In addition to the regular weekly services, the worship ministry attempts to provide many special events and training opportunities throughout the year that will strengthen us as a worshiping community."

Defining Worship:

In the Bible, there are two distinct words that are used to describe what we call worship. The first word describes the act of "bowing down" before God. This is what we do as we gather together as a church family. We stop our daily routine to focus all of our attention on God. The second word means "service" and it describes the way we live our lives out in the world, as a witness to God's goodness.

However, our English word for "worship" has a slightly different meaning. It comes from the two Old English words weord, meaning "worth" and scipe, meaning "to give" or "to ascribe." So to worship, means to ascribe worth to something or someone. This understanding of worship is actually the common factor between the two biblical definitions. We ascribe worth to God through times of bowing down, and we ascribe worth through acts of service. The goal of the worship ministry, therefore, is to lead us in our times of bowing down as a community in such a way that it will inspire acts of service as individuals.

Musical Styles:

One of the "hot-button" issues that has threatened to disrupt the worshiping community over the past few decades has been the debate over the styles of music used in worship. Thankfully, we at CCBC have largely avoided being divided by this topic. I believe this is due, at least in part, to two values to which we hold.

First of all, we desire that everyone have an opportunity to worship in a way that feels natural to them. This is why we have two separate services with two (slightly) different musical styles. On the other hand, we also believe that worship is not about us. We want to show love to others in the community who may have different backgrounds and preferences. This means being willing, at times, to embrace their forms of worship. For this reason we occasionally invite one team to lead both services or invite the youth team to lead us in worship. I honestly believe that it can be a more significant act of worship to set aside our own preferences out of love and be willing to worship (at least occasionally) in a way that may seem less comfortable to us.

Of course the question of form has to be secondary to the content of a song. No matter what style of music we sing, we work hard to make sure that we are singing theologically sound and personally inspiring words to and about our God.

Building the Musical Community:

Beyond preparing for the weekly services, the Worship Ministry at CCBC also strives to build up the musical community. We do this through events like our "Building Musical Families Luncheon", our seasonal choir, monthly guitar club, youth worship team, the Christian Musician Summit and the Puyallup Homeschool Orchestra. Coming this summer will be the first ever Puyallup Summer Orchestra, which will be open to musicians of all ages and will include brass, woodwind, and percussion sections.
