





A Safe Place to Grow Up

Think for a minute about the process of shopping for clothes. When you go shopping for clothing, you probably look through the racks, select several outfits of varying styles that you think you might like and then take them to the dressing room. There are several questions you are asking of each set of clothes you try on. While you are looking in the mirror, you consider: Do I like it? Does it fit? Is it my style? And then, if you are shopping with another person, you will probably step out of the dressing room and ask the person you are with, "What do you think?" You want to know how they will react to seeing you in that particular outfit.

As kids and teens grow up, they work through a very similar process with their personality and identity. They will "try on" different characteristics, attitudes, opinions and ways of thinking and acting. As they do, they will consider, perhaps subconsciously, Does it fit? Is it me? Do I like how I feel when I wear it? And one of the biggest questions of all, What reaction do I get from others? Do people accept and affirm me when I "put on" that particular aspect of personality?

As parents watching teens figure out and discover their own personality, this can be a confusing and perhaps difficult time ...

An update from: Chad and Jamie Dimon Serving in Nyankunde, Democratic Republic of Congo





Hello friends and family,

We rejoice because we are sending this update from HOME! After 29 days in Uganda, Nyankunde remained free and clear of Ebola and we were allowed to return home last week. Unfortunately, Ebola continues to migrate in Eastern Congo, but it appears to be steadily decreasing away from our area. Please continue to pray for all the medical staff working tirelessly to contain and stop the outbreak. Our team continues to provide support through flights transporting medical equipment, vaccines, and staff for the World

Health Organization and Doctors Without Borders.

Another praise is for the election that recently happened. Although the outcome was controversial and heavily contested, the new president was sworn into office and Congo remains "operations normal." This marks the first time in Congo's history that a successful and peaceful transfer of power has occurred. Praise God!! We appreciate prayers that the peace of God would reign in this conflict saturated nation.

Now for some HAPPY news! Chad has begun his Cessna Grand Caravan check out, AND is having fun! He is enjoying the new challenge and learning the nuances of flying a turboprop aircraft. The Caravan is a beautiful plane that can carry more than twice the passengers and cargo than the smaller C206 (which is an awesome airplane). In terms of ministry impact, this airplane is a force multiplier because we can do LOTS more in a day to support other ministries in Congo with the Caravan than the 206.

Jamie is staying home and not working at the hospital until east Congo is declared Ebola free. This is a bit hard for her since she was hoping to work alongside the nurses after the Helping Babies Breathe training was completed. For now she is homeschooling Gabby (her teacher is currently out of country), getting the infant formula program reorganized, and well, you know everything else that is needed at home:-)

Each year we understand more on a personal level the gratitude and love the Apostle Paul expressed to the church. He conveyed such incredible love for individuals who supplied his needs, and we have experienced that. We need each other, we are all part of the body accomplishing the work the Lord has set before us. Thank you for praying for us, supporting us, and being a part of God's great commission here in Congo, and in the US. The time is short and the days increasingly more evil, so let us be wise. Know that we pray for you as your mission field in the U.S. has its own acute


challenges. We love you guys and are so excited to be doing these more frequent updates.

We have some significant needs of which we would like to make you aware. Please pray with us that these needs will be met.

- 1. We are down to one partially working laptop. It has been declining over the years and needs to be replaced. This is a significant need for our family and one we are trusting God to provide.
- 2. Jamie's iPad suddenly failed (red screen) during our evac time in Uganda. Although this is just a material thing, it's

what she uses predominately to keep organized with projects like the Orphan Milk program, Homeschooling, Young Living, meal planning, as well as just staying connected. It's going to be repaired by Apple, but it's a huge logistical challenge in that it will be hand carried by multiple families and change hands multiple times before we get it back. Pray that it gets repaired and returned without any problems. Also pray that Apple is willing to repair it as what's covered by Apple Care is a bit vaque.

3. We are coming home for furlough in early August and staying until early January. We are in need of a "permanent" place to stay in Western Washington, which is where the majority of our furlough will happen. We also plan to spend several weeks in California as well. Please pray that God would help us find a "home away from home" that allows us to focus on reconnecting with others rather than worrying about our living situa-

tion.
