## "Scripture Surprises"

My New Year's Resolution for 2017 is to read through the entirety of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation. Even though I have studied much of the Bible and know much about its content and context, I have never read the Bible from cover to cover. The task is daunting as the Bible is comprised of 66 books, 1189 chapters, and just over 805,000 words. As one that never was much of a reader, my elementary teachers would be proud that I was setting such a lofty goal.



I began my resolution on January 1 and I just surpassed the half way point, which is Psalm 117. I must admit that there have been a few times, especially in Leviticus and 2 Chronicles, that I questioned the sanity of this resolution. As marathon runners will talk about "hitting the wall" during a race, I felt that I was banging my head against a wall on several points in this journey. The book of Leviticus, filled with rules and regulations, reads more like a manual of operations. Chronicles has name after name of those who were a part of the Jewish exile to Babylon in the 6th century BC. I wanted to skip to the good parts, the likes of Matthew, Mark, Luke, John—much more familiar territory. But like the Israelites in the wilderness, I persevered and pressed forward even when the way became difficult.

In this journey of reading through the Bible I have wandered upon a few unexpected surprises. I will name my top three.

- 1. The Dysfunction of God's Family: Right out of the gates, beginning with the first family of the Bible, Adam and Eve ushered in a long line of dysfunctional families in the Bible. I think of Cain and Able, Jacob and Esau, Joseph and his brothers, Lot and his wife, Ahab and Jezebel. The stories of dysfunctional families in the Bible are like God's promises: never-ending. Yet amid the dysfunction that persists in every book, God is faithful in the Lord's care and concern for his people. God seems to always provide way for people to come back to the Lord, drawing them in by his grace and mercy.
- 2. The Surprise of Hezekiah: Hezekiah, one of the many kings in Israel's history, stands as a model for ministry. Throughout his entire life, he never waivered in his devotion to the Lord. Where other kings would allow things to dissuade them in their faith, Hezekiah remained steadfast in his walk with God and provides a great blueprint for us living today.
- 3. The Steadfast Love of God is the reoccurring baseline in the Bible. In spite of dysfunctional families, ill-willed decisions, sin and shortcomings, God is faithful still. That faithfulness culminates in Jesus Christ who stands in our place as forgiveness is offered for the sins of the world. I have a great appreciation for God and the new life that is offered freely through the grace of God given by Jesus Christ.

I look forward to growing more in my faith and learning more about God's ways in 2017, and I invite you to share in the journey.

## A study on Revelation is coming in March





Congratulations to Grayson Powell, infant son of Parker and Ashley Powell, who was baptized during worship on Sunday, January 29.


Linda Haden has returned home after being hospitalized for a few days with stomach issues.

### **Mission News**

How much do you know about the YWCA? The Program Director of Gateway House, Erin Lambert spoke at the Mission Committee meeting and shared that the YWCA helps people through a Child Center and Pre-Kindergarten; Clinical Services to help people who need counseling and legal issues; Co-Enrollment to help with skills training, jobs and housing; and Gateway House. Gateway House is a secure domestic violence shelter for up to 35 individuals in need of a safe haven. They serve those who have no other options. Gateway House, through YMCA helps families work toward a brighter, stronger future. The Mission Committee donated \$2,500.00 to Gateway House.

Last Fall, the Mission Committee gave \$5,000 to Kristin Van Nostran, a missionary who worked with World Mission. Kristin is no longer with World Mission so she is not getting the money. It was suggested that we give the money to Tracey King-Ortega who works with churches in Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua. The \$5,000 will be going to Tracey instead.

George and Kathy Goodrich continue their ministry work for our Yellowstone Presbytery. We will support them this year with a gift of \$2,500.

January's Noisy Offering of \$753.58 went to Young Families Early Head Start. They serve children and their parents who will probably qualify for Head Start but are too young. They serve children birth to 4 years old. Our fun and noise will be transformed into books, musical instruments, and other needs for these very young children. The Mission Committee will be matching the funds for this worthwhile organization bringing the total donation to Young Families to \$1,507.16. Thanks to all who gave toward this special offering.

Family Promise returns to our church from March 5-11. Helpers are needed with set-up, meals, overnight hosts, and clean-up. If you have an interest in helping with this local mission need, please talk to either Chris Eriksen or Marv & Janet Brown. Family Promise is a local organization which helps homeless families get back on their feet.
