PASTOR'S PEN

"More Than Eggs and Bunnies"



On Sunday, April 16 we will gather for a very important celebration: Easter. For us Christians, Easter is more than eggs and bunnies, baskets and ham; it is the great proclamation that Jesus is Risen! I like to think of Easter as the New Year's Day of the soul. Easter is special for us for many reasons, a few of which are:

1. Easter reminds us that death is not the final chapter in our lives. Ever since sin entered the world through Adam and Eve in Genesis 2, the consequences for sin were death. The Garden of Eden was supposed to be a place of abundant life and joy, but the effect of sin changed that reality. Throughout the Old Testament, the penalty for sin was remediated through sacrifice and good words. However, our efforts always fell short and never quite measured up. God provided a different way, a better way, through Jesus. Upon the cross, God gave the once and for all sacrifice through Jesus Christ to overcome the powers of sin, and subsequently, the consequences of death. Jesus' resurrection opens the way for us to experience and enjoy eternal life-- a life not only here on earth, but also one eternally with God in heaven.

2. Easter assures us with the living present of God. One of the great promises throughout the Bible is God's assurance that the Lord will not leave or forsake us. No matter how desperate life becomes or how good we have things, God is always there to walk with us. This promise is not realized any more significantly that on Easter when Jesus came forth from the tomb and made his presence known to his followers. Over a period of 40 days Jesus appeared to his followers and assuring them of his presence and promises. We are blessed by this same promise 2,000 years later of a God who walks with us on the mountain top and in the valley.

3. Easter reminds us that we are to be people of hope. The headlines in the newspapers and on the news can cause us to lose hope. We live in a world of accidents, tragedies, and pain. There are friends who are dying of cancer, those who are in the midst of relational problems and unexplainable things that cause us to question of faith and doubt God. Yet, as we gather as people of faith, we realize that in the end victory is imminent. The Apostle Paul, who experienced more than his share of pain, discouragements, and setbacks, writes of this good hope in 1 Corinthians 15:57, "Thanks be to God, who gives us victory through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

I look forward to Easter and being with you to celebrate this Good News. God is good and his steadfast love endures forever and to all generations. Let us come together and celebrate the victory, hope, and promise of God's blessings on Sunday, April 16 with services offered at 8:30 AM and 10:30 AM.

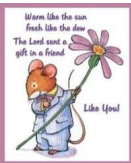

APRIL 2 Ed Kemmick, editor of the Last Best News will speak about “Fake News—What are the Implications?” There has always been some bias in the media, some distortion, some sloppiness, and some outright errors. But now, thanks mainly to the internet, we have a new kind of ‘fake news,’ a troubling development with implications for culture, religion, politics, and the future of a democratic society. A reporter, editor, and columnist in Montana for most of the last 37 years, Ed began ‘Last Best News,’ an independent online newspaper three years ago that has a daily readership of 2000. He received the National Journalist of the Year in 2002 when at the Billings Gazette.

APRIL 9 Tom Keightley, Crime Prevention Officer for the Billings Police Department. Tom will give an update on the current state of crime and law enforcement in Billings. He will also provide ideas about personal safety and how to prevent becoming a victim. With over 80 Bible verses related to law enforcement, Tom will also discuss the police chaplain’s program provided by the department.

APRIL 16 No Sunday School classes on Easter Sunday

APRIL 23 Gene Jarussi, lawyer with Bishop, Heenan, and Davies Law Firm, will discuss “Our Christian Principles, The Law, and A Court Case.” As Christians in Montana, do we care that our politicians comply with our campaign finance laws? And if they don’t comply, are we brave enough to hold them accountable? Is our political system being undermined by corporations and politicians who fail to follow our Montana law? Gene Jarussi, a retired Billings attorney, came out of retirement to handle five such cases—one of which was tried before a Montana jury in late March of 2016. These cases center on Montana’s campaign finance laws that prohibit corporate contributions and require all contributions to be reported to the Commission of Political Practices. Mr. Jarussi will explain how the evidence was collected, what was presented to the jury, and the final verdict in the case tried last spring.

APRIL 30 Dr. Terry Bouck, Superintendent of School District 2 will be our guest. Jesus was addressed directly 90 times in the gospels, 60 of which he was called “teacher.” Superintendent Bouck will give an overview of the Billings school system, including the challenges and successes. With the upcoming bond issue he will discuss improvements to be made if it passes.

Mission News

Some time ago, Peace Lutheran Church started a food pantry to help feed some of our hungry neighbors. The need has grown and grown. Bernie Mason and Pastor Will Sappington from Peace Lutheran came to our Mission Committee meeting and shared information about this ministry. They serve the disabled, seniors, unemployed, Native Americans, and individuals from all over Billings. They are open 2 or 3 hours each week day. There were over 4,000 visitors in 2016. Therefore, the church has a sign-in-desk to make sure there are no abuses to the system. St. Pius X, St. Johns, Peace Lutheran, and First Presbyterian are the main supporters of the program. They could use more volunteers to work the desk (2 hours per day). The Peace Lutheran pantry is open the following hours and they need volunteers to help at these times. Monday from 1-3 PM; Thursday from 10-12 AM; Friday from 2-4 PM. They are also opened on Tuesday and Wednesday but don’t need volunteers those days. The committee will give \$750 per quarter for this year to Peace Lutheran for their food pantry needs



We voted to be one of the 12 church sponsors (\$2,000 each) for a Habitat House in Billings this year. The house will be build this summer and volunteer assistance will be needed. More information will be coming about this special project.

We will also support our friends at Family Promise with a check for \$1,500.
