The mission committee had the honor of listening to Charles and Melissa Johnson, PCU-SA missionaries in Zambia. Charles teaches agriculture classes to help the people use the land better to feed their families and have something to sell. Melissa serves in the health department as a health education programs facilitator. They ask for prayers for the work they do serving the people of Zambia. Our noisy offering in October will go to this important ministry.
