Pastor's Pen

"Living Generously"

If you turn on the television or radio these days, you will find all kinds of news about people who are living in protest, anger, and fear. Some NFL players and teams are protesting during the playing of the National Anthem due to escalating racial tension in our country and recent comments made by our President. It is a common occurrence to find various group marching on the National Mall in Washington, DC, or staging protests



at universities and communities to promote a particular race, nationality, or political party. Our country's motto of One Nation Under God has sadly diminished from the original intentions of those who founded our country and drew up our Constitution.

What does it look like to live with a generous heart? How are we, as people living in one nation under God's sovereign grace, to act toward one another? Jesus summed it up well by saving, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments" (Matthew 22: 37-40).

The lessons which Jesus teaches in this passage are among those we learned at an early—treat others as you want to be treated, show kindness to others, and respect others' space and opinions. Even as elementary as many of these lessons are to understand, they are very difficult to carry out in the political, social, and even religious arenas of life.

The church must set an example for how to live with a generous spirit and we will be doing our best over the next two months to help shape this understanding. Starting on Sunday, October 15, we will begin our "Living Generously" campaign that will culminate on Generosity Sunday, which will be celebrated on Sunday, November 19. During these six weeks we will be learning from the Bible and others in the church at to how we can live with a joyful and generous spirit.

It is easy to become cynical, calloused, and critical in life. It doesn't take much effort to find the negative in our world. But to live with a generous spirit is to rise above the fray, to swim against the current, and to reach out beyond barriers to show God's kindness and love as expressed through Jesus Christ.

I look forward to finding examples in God's word and others in the church who are living with a generous spirit. May we use these coming weeks to set a good example and to regain our unity under God which is our inalienable right and privilege as citizens of this great country.





Church and Society Class

Our church and Society Class, facilitated by Shari Dayton, is in its 35th year at our church. This class meets every Sunday morning in the Church and Society Room and welcomes a different guest speaker every week. The topics all relate to church and society in one way or another. If you have a suggestion for a guest presenter, please let Shari know. Our guest for the month of October are:

October 1: Craig Carse, our church's new Ministry Intern, will speak about "God Doesn't Make Any Junk." After coaching college basketball for many years, Craig brings a wide variety of educational, teaching, and mentoring experience to his position with our church. Come and hear Craig share about God's transformative ways through the power and grace of Jesus Christ.

October 8: Virginia Smith, free-lance writer and lecturer will present, "Everything you Wanted to Know about the Saint John's Bible." In 1998 a well know calligrapher was commissioned to hand write and hand illuminate what was to become the Saint John's Bible. It took 7 years to complete and is considered a work of art. Virginia Smith will elaborate on the 7 year process and show a copy of the series. Virginia has partnered to write "Scripture from Scratch and 'God for Grownups.

October 15: Pastor Dave will present "Comedy and Christianity: Reflecting on 20 years in the ministry." Dave will share some of his more memorable experiences in the life of the church, how comedy has helped him maintain a good perspective as a pastor, and how Jesus Christ has been an incredibly steady influence in his personal life. Being a pastor allows one to enter into situations that make you smile, causes you to cry, and enables one to discover God's grace on a first hand basis. Pastor Dave will share several stories about weddings, funerals, and other church experiences that has helped him to see the "joy in the Lord."

October 22: Dr. Don Harr, Psychiatrist, and Sharron Hoy, Psychiatric Nurse, will present, "No Hope? Don't Believe It." This will be a presentation relating to suicide prevention, hope, resilience, and anti-Christian behavior, Sharron will discuss her journey to wellness. She and Don will explain how mental illness is a medical problem and avenues where help is available. Sharron, a book author, serves on the Mental Health Advisory Board in Billings.

October 29: David Orser who is a Middle East Expert. The Middle East is filled with uncomfortable topics with very few solutions. David s presentation will offer information about Madrasas, non-denominational Imans, FCPA, and profiling with time for questions and answers. David lived and worked in Libya and the region for 35 years. He holds a graduate degree in International Relations and was an Associate member of the Royal Institute at Chatham House in London.
