




# Pastor's Pen

Cindy Leggate has had several heart procedures this past month at St. V's Hospital.


Deb McClain will soon begin chemotherapy treatments for breast cancer.



**JANUARY 7:** Dr. Charlotta Eaton will present "Understanding and Responding to Dementia-Related Behavior." Join us to learn to decode behavioral messages, identify common behavior triggers, and learn strategies to help intervene with some of the most common behavioral challenges of Alzheimer's disease. This is the third in our series about the many facets of dementia that includes Alzheimer's.

Judge Watters made history as the first woman in Montana to become a US district judge in the state of Montana. She was recently confirmed by the US Senate.

The diverse communities who have lived in the badlands of Montana and North Dakota have seen dramatic changes over centuries—boom towns have withered into ghost towns when the weather turned or jobs disappeared, only to thrive again; today, an influx of people, wealth and development is once again transforming the area. Makoshika is an artful, informative portrait of a fascinating American region undergoing yet another huge transformation. Directed by Billings Photographer Jessica Jane Hart. This is Stan's second documentary and this spring he and Peter will begin their next project of retracing the war experiences of a Billings Vietnam veteran. Stan grew up in our church and is the son of Carlene Taubert and Mark Parker.

# An update from Charles and Melissa Johnson, missionaries in Zambia, Africa

Dear Friends at First Presbyterian Church,

Melissa and I want to thank you for your recent donation in support of our work in Zambia. Financial and prayer support are vital to us. We had a great time meeting with members of the mission team when we were there in August and appreciated the opportunity to share our work with you.

Melissa and I arrived back in Zambia, in mid-November to pretty severe power problems. We were going up to three days without electricity, which also affected our having water. When the grocery store is two hours away, it complicates things. The situation has now improved and while it doesn't stay on all the time, we have power for about 12 hours each day, and that's enough to keep things in the freezer and refrigerator cold. Fortunately Presbyterian World Mission approved reimbursement for a generator to provide power if we need it. We have a group coming from First Presbyterian Church of Burlington, NC, next month, and the generator will come in handy.

We are both settling back into our work routine, as well as life in Zambia. We've been busy at Chasefu, working to get crops planted. The rains began in November, and have been a little spotty, but I believe it's finally safe to say rainy season has arrived. The Model Farm is planting maize, and the Agricultural Income Generating Activity is planting pigeon peas, groundnuts and soybeans. During a recent trip to Malawi, I got some coffee bean seed and we're going to plant a test plot to see how it performs.

Melissa is getting her ducks in a row to begin a sewing and education project which provides washable, reusable feminine hygiene products for girls, to keep them in school. She's been involved with a program called Days for Girls beginning with our short term work in DR Congo.

We want to thank you again for your recent gift to our support and your prayers. Both are greatly appreciated. Please express our gratitude to our friends there. Here's wishing all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
