On Sunday, April 1 we will gather for a very important celebration: Easter. For us Christians, Easter is more than baskets and bunnies; Easter is the great proclamation that Christ is Risen! Easter lies at the foundation of our Christian beliefs and I like to think of Easter as the New Year's Day of the soul. Easter is significant for us for many reasons, a few of which are:

1. Easter reminds us that death does not have the final word in our lives. Ever since sin entered the world through Adam and Eve in Genesis 2, the consequences for sin were death. The Garden of Eden was supposed to be a place of abundant life and joy, but the effect of sin changed that reality. Throughout the Old Testament, the penalty for sin was remediated through sacrifice and good words. However, our efforts always fell short and never quite measured up. God provided a different way, a better way, through Jesus. By the cross, God gave the once and for all sacrifice through Jesus Christ to overcome the powers of sin, and subsequently, the consequences of death. Jesus' resurrection opens the way for us to experience and enjoy eternal life-- a life not only here on earth, but also one eternally with God in heaven.

2. Easter assures us with the living present of God. One of the great promises throughout the Bible is God's assurance that he will not leave or forsake us. No matter how desperate life becomes or how good things get, God is always there to walk with us. This promise is not realized any more significantly that on Easter when Jesus came forth from the tomb and made his presence known to his followers. Over a period of 40 days Jesus appeared to his followers assuring them of his presence and promises. We are blessed by this same promise 2,000 years later of a God who walks with us on the mountain tops and in the valleys.

3. Easter reminds us that we are people of hope. The headlines in the newspapers and on the news can cause us to lose hope. We live in a world of accidents, addictions, shootings, tragedies, and pain. We know of people who are dying of cancer, those who are in the midst of relational problems, and others who face unexplainable things that cause us to question of faith and doubt God. Yet, as we gather as people of faith, we realize that in the end victory is imminent. The Apostle Paul, who experienced more than his share of pain, discouragements, and setbacks, writes of this good hope in 2 Corinthians 15:57, "Thanks be to God that we have victory through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

I look forward to Easter and being with you to celebrate this Good News. God is good and his steadfast love endures forever and to all generations. Let us come together this coming Sunday and celebrate the victory, hope, and promise of God's blessings. Easter worship services offered at 8:30 AM and 10:30 AM. A breakfast will be served in our fellowship hall from 9:15-10:00 AM and an Easter egg hunt for the kids will begin at 9:30 AM. Join us as we celebrate our Risen Savior! In Christ.

Sunday, April 1: There will be no Church & Society class on Sunday, April 1 due to the Easter holiday.

Sunday, April 8: Senator Margie MacDonald, Former Executive Director Montana Association of Churches, will talk about Justice Reinvestment reforms in Montana. The 2017 Montana Legislature adopted a sweeping package of criminal justice reforms aimed at being smart on crime. Justice reinvestment focuses on practices that have been proven to reduce recidivism and increase public safety, hold offenders accountable, support victims of crime and ensure that communities are focusing on treatment of substance abuse and mental illness.

Sunday, April 15: Kassie Runsabove, Health Disparities Co-ordinator at St. Vincent Healthcare. With the purpose of providing fellowship, cultural sensitivity, and positive outcomes for the Native American population. Kassie will describe how she accomplishes this with patients and families. She will also discuss her work with the chaplains and the cultural sensitivity training she leads for clinical pastoral education.

Sunday, April 22: Mary Jane Knisely, State District Court Judge in Yellowstone County. Judge Knisely has the privilege of presiding over a Veterans Treatment Court, CAMOCourts Assisting Military Offenders. She will discuss how this innovative program serves our justice entangled military, but providing treatment, accountability, and a second chance to restore honor. In addition, Judge Knisely will cover the felony impaired Driving Court STEER Sobriety, Treatment, Excellence, Education and Rehabilitation. The presentation will explain how a multidisciplinary team provides intense oversight and treatment to high risk repeat DUI and Drug addicted drivers, with the purpose of halting recidivism.

Sunday, April 29: Ron Frank, from the Gideons International, will talk about "Who are the Gideons?" Ron will give a brief personal witness, followed by discussing the history of the Gideons and where they are today in their world wide witnessing and goals.
