Mission News

The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit. Psalm 34:18 The Mission Committee met at Tumbleweed last month got a tour and also had the opportunity to ask questions. Tumbleweed serves at risk youth from 13 years through 20 years of age. They now have an evening "Drop in Center" and counselors available. The teens may sleep overnight, if they don't have a place to stay. The kids may also attend life skill classes after school. Our group was impressed by their various programs.



Many times the Tumbleweed youth are "the brokenhearted" and "those who are crushed in spirit" that the Psalmist talks about. The Lord is close to them and so many others of us. He uses us, His children to take care of them. The Mission Committee voted to donate \$4,000 to Tumbleweed. Finances are only part of the ways that we can help. We also take hygiene products to the kids so that they can feel and smell clean. We give them gifts through the Angel Tree at Christmas and we are looking at other ways we can help such as supplying meals from time to time. If you want to help, talk to Pastor Dave, or Ken Eichenberger.

Biff Hogue has introduced us to her sister-in-law, Esther Wakeman, who is a missionary of the Presbyterian World Mission in Thailand. For over two decades she has been teaching, mentoring and counseling at Payap University. We will send Esther \$2,500 to help in her ministry and look forward to learning more about her ministry and ways we can help and get to know her.

Once there is a final tally of the church members' donation to "One Great Hour of Sharing" the committee will match their contribution up to \$2,500.

The summer is always a busy time at Friendship House and to support their kids we will send the organization a check for \$5,000.
