We are planning another training of Stephen Ministers beginning this October. This training will be conducted at our church by Doris Backus, Shirley Shirley, and Pastor Dave and

The people are each assigned a care receiver who they meet with about every two weeks and provide listening, encouragement, and spiritual support. ### **Mission** News

Pastor Dwight Welch spoke to our committee about their student programs at MSUB Campus Ministry. They meet several times during the weekdays. They have a weekly prayer session, an afternoon of table talk and movies, and a coffee hour. At spring break a small group went to Sheridan to assist some needy folks in the area. Next fall Dwight hopes to start a bible study. About 60% of their operating funds come from area churches and 40% from their annual fall fundraiser dinner. We will consider ways to help them at our August meeting.

The church members donated \$1,682.02 to One Great Hour of Sharing in April and the mission committee will match those funds and send a check to National in the amount of \$3,364.04.

We continue to help Peace Lutheran Church with their food pantry in a continuing effort to feed our hungry neighbors. We will send them a check for \$750 for our quarterly commitment to their food pantry program. Jim Bell of Eagle Rock Sanctuary informs us of needs to repair road and the cost of new decking on the building. All this will cost between \$5,000 and \$6,000. We will assist by sending them \$3,500.

The committee will once again sponsor the Foundation for Suicide Prevention with a \$2,000 donation. Ruth Ewen gave us some literature to read on the ministry of Les and Cindy Morgan, Presbyterian mission-

aries in Bangladesh. We will review this information at the next meeting.

Family Promise returned to our church from June 10-17. We will be hosting four homeless families during that week. Your help would be appreciated. A volunteer sign up can be found on the bulletin board near the Fireside Room.
