It's that time of year again when we seek your help and assistance in making a financial commitment to our church's ministry. We often view this period of stewardship campaigning as merely of giving money to the church. Most of us approach stewardship campaigns with groans and sighs as we know that it is our obligation to give. In some ways I tend to feel like a salesman during this period, trying to "sell" our ministry and having you "buy" into our product. In the end, this process often leaves me feeling a bit uncomfortable and uneasy.

Instead of thinking of stewardship as some form of obligation, I would like to think of it as an opportunity. Instead of approaching our giving as something we do out of compulsion, I want us to think of it as a way of showing our appreciation to God and others. The Apostle Paul reminds in his second letter to the Christians in Corinth, "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver "(2 Corinthians 9:6-7). When we view our stewardship as a way of using God's resources and that our resources were entrusted to us by God, we begin to have a better understanding how God can use us to make a difference in our community and world. Leading up to Stewardship Sunday on November 18, you have been hearing and will continue to hear more about this approach to giving. We have been placed on the earth, by the very breath of God, to make a difference in the lives of others. Through the ministry we carry out, we provide compassion, care, counsel, and education to a number of people within our church and far beyond our physical property. We are making a difference through the work of Habitat for Humanity, Family Promise, Presbyterian missions, and others. Within the coming week, you should receive a pledge card in the mail inviting you to share in the

ministry of our church. I would encourage you to prayerfully consider how you will use your time, talents, and treasures to respond to God's call upon your life. We provide a number of ways for you to express your faith and I would love to help you explore avenues in which God is calling you to share your gifts. When we respond through giving for the glory of God, we certainly do make a difference in the lives of others and our lives as well! I look forward to worshipping with you on the next Lord's Day!

One of the youth in our church purchased \$10 worth of gas in his lawn mower to mow lawn for the less fortunate. Another family in our church donated their \$10 plus an additional \$100 of their own money to a local food bank. Another individual used his \$10 as seed money and then found others who were willing to donate \$10 each from his Rotary Club. The money grew to \$600 through a grant given through the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to purchase polio vaccines. 6,000 vaccinations were purchased at a cost of 10 cents each. Now that is creative! Continue to share your stories with Pastor Dave.

We asked the congregation to donate diapers for the children at Young Families/Early Head Start through the month of October. Thank you so much for bringing in lots and lots of diapers!! They greatly appreciated them! Global Village items will be on sale on Sunday, November 11 before and after worship in the fellowship hall. Global Village supports fair trade practices with third world countries. Come and do some shopping.

On Sunday, November 18<sup>th</sup> we will be having another noisy offering. This offering will go to support the Presbyterian mission agency in purchasing a "Family Farm Bundle" for a 3rd world country. Your offering will go to purchase chickens, livestock, grain, and equipment to help establish a farm. We invite you to give generously. Before Thanksgiving, we will have the Angel Tree up with this year's gifts going to support Presbyterian mis-

sions. The tree will be filled with a variety of gift ideas, ranging in price from \$10 on up to \$100.

We are again thankful to be able to donate \$1,250 to Lewis & Clark Middle School for their food pantry. Dwight Welch, the new campus minister at MSU-B, has already tripled the student involvement in his worship

services and coffee hours. We will send him a check for \$1,000 to support their campus ministry. We gave \$500 to Lisa Laird for her work with iEmergence in Canada, a Christian based organization working with the indigenous population. Lisa is the daughter of Priscilla Laird.
