Promises, promises, promises. We are people of promises. We promise to love and to cherish. We promise to pay back the loan on our home mortgage. We promise to tell the whole truth and nothing but the truth. Yet, many have found themselves at the end of broken promises...to be faithful, to repay a debt, or to love as long as we both shall live.

These broken promises can leave us vulnerable, cynical, and deeply hurt. During this season of Advent I want us to look at the idea of promise from the great Promise Keeper. God, throughout the Bible, makes a promise (or in biblical terms a covenant) to walk with us, encourage us, and redeem us. This promise began all the way back in Genesis with Abraham and was fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ. God's promise continues today through the work of the Holy Spirit.

I will be teaching a Sunday school class called "The Promise," beginning this Sunday, December 2 at 9:15 AM in the Fireside Room. We will be looking at the strand of promise that weaves its way through the Bible, from Abraham, to Ruth, to David, and eventually to Jesus. This interesting class will be a great course through the Old Testament and the promise that God made to some fairly unsuspecting people. Come and join us as we travel 2,500 years leading up to the time of Jesus, the fulfilled promise.

I will also be preaching a sermon series during Advent called "A Light in the Darkness." In this series we will be looking at some of the most important promises God has given to us through the lens of the prophet Isaiah and how they apply to our lives today. It is easy to lose hope, as it would have been for those who followed God during the time of Isaiah. We will be looking at the promise that God makes in Isaiah 7:14, "Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel;" in Isaiah 9:6, "For unto us a child shall be born...and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace;" in Isaiah 11:1, "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse and the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him;" and in Isaiah 40:3, "A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord." I look forward to remembering God's promises and being renewed in the hope of Jesus' coming again.

Advent devotionals are once again available for you to use during this special season. These free devotionals, titled "God With Us" are available in the gallery. I hope you will embrace this season of Advent, holding on to the promises of God, and being renewed in the strength, hope, and peace that we have through Christ.

It is a special time of the year and I pray that you will take advantage of all of the ways that we provide to help you draw closer to the Lord. May God bless you during this special season. Waiting Expectantly,

## CASA volunteers needed

Statewide, the number of children entering foster care due to abuse or neglect in recent years has skyrocketed. In Yellowstone County, the number of children removed from their home has increased drastically from 182 in 2014 to 574 in 2017, resulting in more than 800 children currently in foster care. You could be the voice for one of these children by becoming
