# Pastor's Pen

Our church's annual congregational meeting was held last Sunday, January 27 as a number of reports were presented from various committees and organizations in our church. In all, 2018 was a good year for our congregation and we approach the new year with high hopes and expectations.



During our meeting the following members were elected to serve on our leadership team: Session members elected to a three year term are Dick Bailey, Kristy Catlin, Heather McLean, and Bruce Phillips. Heather is coming back to serve a second three year term, which is permissible via our by-laws. Deacons elected to three year terms are Peggy Cluff, Pam Harr, Len & Bonnie Richards, and Janice Ward. Peggy and Janice are both returning to serve a second term.

Four people were elected to serve on our church's nominating committee in 2019. These individuals will be working with me this coming fall to come up with nominees for elders and deacons to present at our congregational meeting next year. Those who were elected to serve on the nominating committee are Larry George, Teri Pattee, Bernice Phillips, and John Stewart.

Our 2019 budget was presented and will be approved at our February session meeting. A budget of \$434,896 includes \$50,000 in charitable mission giving (a 10% increase over last year), a 2% cost of living raise for staff members, and a few adjustments to committee budgets. We also have funds set aside for a staff person to work in the area of Christian education and youth ministry. We are currently receiving applications to fill this role.

In March we will commission our newest group of Stephen Ministers. This group of 11 has been meeting every week to fulfill the requirements of the 50 hours of training needed to become certified Stephen Ministers. Once commissioned they will be given a care receiver, someone who they will meet with regularly to provide spiritual support and encouragement.

I am excited to see our reFUEL group on Sundays evenings off to such a good start. We have about 25 people attending this evening study on 1 John. I would like to see us offer more small group studies as a way for people to draw closer to God and one another.

It's fun to see many in our church working on a goal through our "New Start 2019" series. Many are making significant life changes through the challenge I posed last month. We will culminate this with a New Start 2019 Celebration on Sunday, February 17 with a party after church. Bring your favorite goodie to share and we will celebrate your accomplishment.

During the season of Lent, beginning on Sunday, March 10, I will be preaching a five part sermon series titled "Going Deeper." We will be looking at ways to deepen our faith and trust in God.



#### **Mission News**

The Mission Committee is excited to start a new year of helping God's children in His name. We have some exciting ideas for the future, so look for them in the coming months. Our total mission budget for 2019 will be \$85,500 and of this \$50,000 is designated for charitable giving to those in our community and beyond. In addition our church supports the weekly worship service provided through our West Park Ministry Team, our bus ministry that goes out each Sunday to West Park and St. John's, mission support to our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly, a Pas-



tor's Discretionary Fund which is used to help people in crisis, fellowship outreach and advertising, and the Stephen Ministry program. During this past month our church provided meals to homeless served through the HUB in downtown

Billings. The HUB provides a noon meal each day and are always looking for groups to provide a warm meal for their population.

We also provided a meal to the Habitat for Humanity work crew last month. Habitat is a Christian organization whose primary purpose is to build affordable housing for low income families. They have competed nearly 80 homes in the Billings area. Our church is sponsoring the building of a Habitat house this summer. Look for ways that you can get involved in either helping with the construction, providing a meal. Some from our church will be attending Habitat's annual fundraiser on Saturday, April 6.

Our mission committee is always open to new ideas and ministries that we can support. We look for ways that we can impact people in our communion, throughout our region, and around the world. We support three missionary families who work through the Presbyterian church, coming along side of them to support them with our prayers and finances.

Our youth group engages in a mission project every month as a way to teach young people the value of giving. We look forward to partnering with St. John's Ministry, the Montana Rescue Mission, St. Vincent de Paul, and other organizations in town to build relationships between our youth group and their clientele.

In response to our Noisy Offering and Angel Tree gifts to Presbyterian missions at Christmas we received the following note, "Thank you for your generous giving, which is a testament to your concern for people in need. Gifts like yours are helping to change the lives of families and communities throughout the world. You are improving the physical well-being of people and nurturing hope.
