

# Memory Joggers for April 2019



On Sunday, April 21 we will proclaim with Christians around the world, "Jesus Christ has Risen!" Easter Sunday represents the crux of our faith whereby Jesus Christ conquered the grave and overcame the powers of death, sin, and sadness. It has been said that Easter is the New Year's Day of the soul as our lives are eternally changed by the events on that first Easter morning.

The Bible is full of story after story of people who are transformed by the risen Christ. The lives of Peter, John, James, Mary, and Paul were dramatically changed by that single event. That event is still changing lives today through the Risen Christ who lives within us through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit. Because of Easter we have hope and assurance that our Risen Lord is still with us today.

I invite you to join us on Easter morning as we gather together to make the great proclamation that the power of God is alive and well. Sometimes we have insurmountable objects that stand in our way and we wonder how will we be able to get through them. This story reminds us to look up and to trust in God and he will make a way where there seems to be no way.

Leading up to Easter Sunday I would invite you to join us for our Holy Week Challenge by attending all of the Holy Week services offered at our church. We will gather on Thursday, April 18 at 7:00 PM for a Maundy (sorrowful) Thursday service in our sanctuary that will help us remember the pain and sorrow Jesus experienced before his crucifixion. On Friday, April 19 we will gather at our church with our neighbors from Peace Lutheran and St. Stephen's Episcopal churches for **INSIDE THIS** ISSUE: our annual ecumenical Good Friday Service at 7:00 PM.

I look forward to worshipping with you during this special season as we reaffirm our trust in a God who is alive, who has conquered death, and who invites Church Mice us to experience the joy of the resurrected families and remember to continue to Look Up!

The Mission Committee is a lively group who love the Lord and love taking care of his people. We now have a grant program for members of our congregation to ask for funds up to \$1,000

to serve the least of God's children and in doing so, we serve Him. Grant applications are available in the church office or through Pastor Dave. It is a short form asking for your name, proposed project, amount of money requested, the purpose of your project and a few other simple questions. Also we would like to know if the grant recipients would be willing to share their project with the congregation. The mission committee will look over your request and let you know if we approve it.

We also have a similar application for a grant for organizations outside of our congregation who are asking for money. We are asking them for their contact information, proposed project, amount requested (up to \$5,000), expenses, purpose of the project including how they serve the least of God's children. This process and the information we receive, will not only makes everyone who receives money accountable to us, but also helps us to be accountable to you, our congregation.

For several years, we have helped both Lewis & Clark Middle School, and Peace Lutheran Church with their food pantries. We will be giving each of them \$1000.00 for food to give to needy students and families.

We will also be giving Global Village \$2,000.00 for ongoing expenses.

Gateway House continues to serve victims of domestic violence. When women and children leave Gateway House to live on their own, they are given items to set up an apartment. We have given Betty Ann Nesmith \$500 to purchase items such as blankets, flatware, cleaning supplies, and hygiene products for that purpose. Thank you Betty Ann.

We will also be participating in another "Apostle's Build" for Habitat for Humanity. We along with 12 other churches will be donating \$2,000 for that project. The house is scheduled to be built this summer off of Dorothy Lane in the Heights. A kickoff breakfast for the build will be held at our church on Saturday, June 8.

Our One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) Fishing Derby continues until Easter. Pick up your One Great Hour of Sharing fish bank in the gallery. We will have our weigh in on Easter Sunday, April 21. We invite you to fill your fish banks will coins and dollars with all proceeds going to support the less fortunate through this annual offering that is received through our denomination.
