The Mission Committee had a guest speaker from the Lewis and Clark Middle School at their monthly committee meeting on April 4. Kevin Brooks, a counselor at the school, is an overseer of the food pantry. We have finically supported the pantry for several years. He said that the pantry serves those students who do not have access to free lunch or have money to buy lunch. We are their only church support. They serve families of the students in need. They stuff backpacks with food to send home with the students. They have served Thanksgiving meals to some families in need. They are very thankful for our donations but do not need anything at this time.

We received a thank you from the director of special offerings from Presbyterian Mission. At Christmas, through our Angel Tree, we gave enough for 3 pair of goats, 2 cows, 4 families of chickens, 2 piglets, 2 beekeeping kits, 2 garden wells, 2 rainwater catchment systems, 4 water filters, 1 bag of moringa tree seeds, 6 sets of farming tools, 1 tree planted, 1 emergency life pack, 5 kitchen kits, supplies for 3 displaced students, 3 sewing machines, education for 4 children, 2 jerry cans, teacher training, school uniforms, bunk beds for children, a refugee food basket, and a partridge in a pair tree. All of these were given through the Presbyterian Giving Catalog. We also gave an additional \$5,000 through our Noisy Offering.

Through one of our new grants, we are giving \$1,000 through the Vision Beyond Borders organization to send Bibles to Venezuela. This grant was submitted by Bruce and Karla Hoffman from our congregation who have supported Vision Beyond Borders for a number of years and have worked with them on several mission trips. On Sunday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> we are having a cookie Sunday. The congregation will be asked to bring in homemade cookies on that Sunday to church. Due to allergies, we ask that you stay away from providing any cookies with peanuts or peanut better. After church we will bag the cookies together for distribution to various charities around the

Billings area, including the Salvation Army and the HUB. "Always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." --Ephesians 5:20
