The year 2019 was another good year in the life of our church. Over the past year we saw growth in both programs and attendance. We launched our new reFUEL group in January that provides a weekly study on various topics and books from the Bible. We commissioned a new group of eleven Stephen Ministers in March. A group of youth traveled to the Presbyterian Youth Triennium conference in Indiana in July. Russ Dornisch came on staff with us in September as our new Youth Pastor and we have seen a growth in our youth ministry programs since his arrival.

We continue a strong relationship with our Better Together Preschool who continue to run at a maximum enrollment capacity of 44 students in their program. Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) meets in our church every Thursday with over 200 women attending a weekly Bible study in our church.

Mission giving continues to expand as we supported a number of mission efforts in our community and around the world. Our church provided a generous donation through our Noisy Offering to the Laps for Life in September, a program that was organized by high school senior Jessie Dimich-Louvet to help raise funds and awareness to the growing population of youth homeless in our area.

I'm looking forward to the New Year and ways that we can continue to grow and expand our ministry. With Russ' help and leadership, I would like to expand our small group ministry platform, enabling more people the opportunity to participate in a small group setting. I have found that relationships with others and God grow best in small group settings. The church will also be working toward updating and expanding our social media platform with an improved website, greater interaction with our members, and improved ways that we can interface with one another.

I will begin a new sermon series titled, "Vision 2020" beginning this Sunday, January 5 and will be leading a new Sunday school class titled, "Rediscovering Jesus" which will begin on Sunday, January 12 at 9:15 AM in the Fireside Room. I hope you will join us for these opportunities to grow deeper in your faith in this New Year.

Cathy McLean was hospitalized at the Billings Clinic last month.



#### Special Class for Adults: "Rediscovering Jesus: Seeing Jesus with Fresh Eyes" with Pastor Dave

For many of us, Jesus has been a part of our lives and vocabulary for our entire lives. Jesus, the central figure of our Christian faith, only lived for 33 years and only ministered for three of those years. This remarkable person however can become so commonplace in our lives that we can easily forget about his influence, power, and redemptive nature. Join Pastor Dave for this seven week class which will help us "Rediscover Jesus." He will help us look at his early life, formal ministry, death and resurrection in seeing Jesus in a new way. This is part of our Vision 2020 series that will be offered throughout this year. This class will begin on Sunday, January 12 at 9:15 AM in the Fireside Room and will continue through February 23.

#### Church and Society Class meets in the C & S Room at 9:15 AM on Sunday mornings. Here is the schedule of speakers for January:

January 12: Dr. Alan Muskett, Cosmetic and Reconstructive Plastic Surgeon, will present, "How to be a Cool Older Person." Does faith play a part in aging and if so, how? In his free time Dr. Muskett has written two books about his medical experiences. He also makes furniture and has been a popular speaker in our class over many years.

January 19: Bill Cole, Billings Mayor, Chairman of the USS Billings Namesake Committee. He will present, "The USS Billings: Our First Naval Service Namesake." What has over 100 miles of electrical and fiber optic cable, 1,000 tons of aluminum, and 2,000 tons of steel? Join us in hearing about the commissioning of the USS Billings that Bill and his wife, Anne, attended and the efforts that made it possible. It is one of the Navy's newest warships that is built for near-shore multi-purpose missions. This is the first time Billings has been honored as a namesake city.

January 26: Virginia Smith, Catholic Theologian. She will present, "Life is Changed, Not Ended." Christians understand that faith in death, resurrection, and eternal life are central to our beliefs. Still, many struggle to make sense of it all. Virginia is the author of a book of the same title and has partnered with Elizabeth McNamer in other writings.

#### Mission News

It's Noisy Offering time again. On January 26<sup>th</sup> we will be collecting noisy and quiet money for Tumbleweed. Tumbleweed provides safety, stability, and hope to vulnerable and homeless and at risk youth.

We are helping Missionary Emily Broadbent. Emily is a missionary at an orphanage in Tanzania. She is 24 years old and has set goals in her life to include staying in Tanzania and continue her missionary work. We are sending her \$1,200 to support.

We are also helping Cathy McLean move to Billings. We are helping financially with the move and also with some man power.

For many years the mission committee has met during the day. So new members can join our committee, we have decided to move the meetings to the fourth Thursday of the month and the meeting time will be 7:00 p.m. In addition to the above, the following expenditures for the remaining year are as follows: The Angel Tree \$500; The Yellowstone Presbytery and the Goodrich's \$3,000; the General Mission Fund of the Presbyterian Church (USA) \$5,000; Family Promise \$1,000; Eagle Rock Sanctuary \$1,000; The Kiva Program \$1,100; the Montana Food Network \$1,100; the Salvation Army \$1,000; the Montana Rescue Mission \$1,000; Family Services, Inc \$2,000; the Friendship House \$3,000; the Hub \$900; and the Crisis Center \$900.

Special thanks to all who donated items to the Angel tree this year. 31 blankets and gifts were taken to the residents of Eagle Cliffs Nursing Home, a home run by Yellowstone County in the Heights. 21 gift cards were given to underprivileged students at Castle Rock Middle School; and several thousand dollars in donations were given to the third world countries through the Presbyterian Giving Catalogue.

We are making a difference in our community and beyond. We, as a church, will continue to strive to reach out to those in need, be a good neighbor, to help the less fortunate, and to bring honor and glory to God in the process. Thanks for helping us make a difference and to be good stewards with all that God has entrusted us.
