We are good at concentrating on our physical bodies when it comes to exercise, but do you ever think about exercising your spiritual muscles? I will begin a new sermon series titled, "The Eyes of Christ" this Sunday. \*Small groups within our church offer more personal growth and fellowship. I hope you will take part in some of the things we offer to help promote your spiritual growth. Come and join us as we get into shape and grow in our relationship with God. I look forward to worshipping with you on the next Lord's Day.

Special Class for Adults: Join Pastor Dave, beginning this Sunday, March 1 at 9:15 AM, for a class titled "Characters of the Crucifixion." Dave will help us take a deeper look at those who played a 🖉 role in the crucifixion and burial of Jesus, including Pontius Pilate, Judas, the two thieves, Simon of Cyrene, the bystanders, and Joseph of Arimathea. This class is intended to help you gain a better understanding of the cross, the central symbol of our faith.

Church and Society Class meets in the C & S Room at 9:15 AM on Sunday mornings. Here is the schedule of speakers for March:

MARCH 1: Erin Baker, Donor Recruitment Manager for MT/WY, Vitalant Blood Donation Center. "Blood Donations and the Impact on our Community." From Christ's crucifixion to the communion sacrament, the blood of Jesus has symbolized the cleansing of our sins. In today's world many are in need of blood transfusions. Learn how Vitalant's 127 donation centers throughout the US supply to nearly 1000 hospitals and health care partners in 40 states.

MARCH 8: Michelle Erickson-Jones, Owner/Operator Gooseneck Land and Cattle, "Agriculture, Tariffs, and the Current Trade Climate". Farming is fueled by science but rooted in faith in the Bible. Join Michelle as she explains how agriculture is impacted by our current trade policy. How do various tariffs affect our sales and input costs? What is the cost to agriculture when the global trading system is in disarray? What does recovery look like for agriculture? Michelle will also address some of the gains made in finalized agreements, what to expect from China, and how we're losing our standing as a reliable supplier around the globe.

MARCH 15: Dr. Melinda Arnold, MSUB Provost and Academic Vice Chancellor, "How Do We Practice Criminal Justice?" Criminal justice is a common theme in the Bible with many related verses. With a Doctorate in Criminal Justice Dr. Arnold will share her expertise in reentry issues, wrongful convictions, plea bargaining, and research in best practices in policing.

MARCH 22: Kurt G. Alme, US Attorney for Montana, "Montana Public Safety; Addressing the Issues." US Attorney Alme will give an overview of current issues facing public safety in Montana and what his office is doing to address them. The issues include violent crime and meth, opioids and elder exploitation. Learn about the recently formed Yellowstone Substance Abuse Connect that is a coalition addressing these problems.

MARCH 29: Dr. Bridget Kevane, Associate Dean MSU Bozeman, "Latinos in Montana." With a heart for Latina women, Dr. Kevane began a program that has received awards to train and mentor these women to be health advocates for their families. In addition to various teaching awards she is considered 'a wonderful leader who has served MSU and the state exceptionally well.'

This tournament will raise funds for both the Africa trip and the youth group. Cost per person is \$50 (team of four is \$200) and will include golf, lunch, and a number of prizes. Stan Parker received grant funds for a film documentary that he is working on to help Vietnam veterans deal with PTSD. These funds will help with the promotion and distribution of this film to help many veterans.
