# Pastor's Pen

# "Keeping the Main Thing the Main Thing"

Many of you have noticed the updating that has been done around the church, namely in the main floor gallery area and the youth room in the basement. New furniture, paint, and decor have been added to these places. We appreciate the help of many who have been a part of these projects.



Yet, I think it is important in light of these updates and improvements to our church facility, that the main thing of our church is to proclaim the love and hope of Jesus Christ. The season of Easter is upon us and as Christians we believe that Easter is the New Year's Day of the soul. We worship a God who is not dead, a Savior who has ascended, and a power that comes through the Holy Spirit that lives in us today. This is the Good News that we believe and proclaim to a world in need of hope.

Life can be pretty discouraging. If you base your hope on the stock market, weather forecast, or a certain team winning the big game, you set yourself up for some disappointment (in case you are wondering I have Florida winning the NCAA tourney). As followers of Christ, "we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen since what we see is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal" (2 Corinthians 4:18). It is this hope that we celebrate during Holy Week, culminating on Easter Sunday.

I hope you will join us during this special season where we walk with Christ through the passion narrative: up the Mount of Olives, through the narrow streets of the Via Dolorosa, up the hill of Golgotha,

and to the sealed tomb. On Easter Sunday I hope you will run with excitement, as did Peter and John, proclaim that "He is Risen!" as we draw to worship and proclaim the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Join us in proclaiming the Good News as we celebrate all that God has done and continues to do. I look forward to this special season and worshiping with you on the next Lord's Day.
