PASTOR'S PEN

"The \$10 Difference"

Typically churches don't give away money during worship. No, churches receive tithes and offering each week from its congregation. But, on Sunday, October 12 our church did something that was unusual and perhaps even a bit strange. We gave out \$10 bills to be used as seed money to make a difference in someone else's life. In all we gave out close to \$1,200 that morning and it has been interesting and fun to see how the money has been used in very creative and generous ways.



One of our members took the \$10 to the local Kiwanis Club and challenged the other club members to contribute to the cause. The \$10 see money was joined with over \$300 from the local club with all of it going to Tumbleweed that works in the Billings area with homeless children and youth.

After doing some research, another couple in our church discovered a 10 to 1 matching grant that is available to help needy children through the Billings Public Schools. The \$10 was quickly transformed into \$110 to help local children with basic needs such as clothing, food, and hygiene items.

Another family used the money to help provide transportation to a 60 year old lady who suffers from a brain injury, an injury she suffered from horrible abuse by her father and brother when she was a teenager. She is disabled and rides the bus to water therapy classes twice a week at St. V's Hospital. The \$10 was used as seed money to provide transportation to and from these special classes.

A family who happened to be visiting our church that Sunday from Dallas, Texas, matched the \$10 seed money and gave a donation to a Dallas Ministry called Heart House that provides assistance to low income immigrant children. With the scare of Ebola in that city, many children are being kept inside. Heart House is helping provide care for these children during this uncertain time.

The ways that the seed money has been used shows both creativity and generosity. Many of you

have given your money (plus additional funds) to local, national, and international ministries. I hope you continue to share your stories with us and how the money has been used.

As one of our members recently wrote, "Thank you so much to our church for providing this opportunity to help others." We are put on earth to make a difference and it is exciting to see it happen in a very real and tangible way.

Keep doing a great work, good and faithful servants! I look forward to worshipping with you on the next Lord's Day and discovering how God might challenge us to continue to carry out his good work.

This four week class will consider the claims about Jesus and will look who he really is: teacher, miracle worker, preacher, savior. Join us as we explore this most interesting and important person.

Church and Society guests for the month on November will be:

NOVEMBER 2: Kelli Liptac, who will talk about "My 20 Year Journey With Heart Disease." Kelli attributes her survival to a strong faith and medical technology. Awaiting a heart transplant, she has an Lvad, a battery run device that keeps her alive. She will tell of her beginnings with heart problems, medical procedures and advances, and how her faith has brought her this far.

NOVEMBER 9: Maria Martin, Case Manager for Passages, will share on the topic, "Prince Charming?" A victim of domestic violence, Maria will detail her experiences with the abuser and her journey to become not only a survivor but a thriver. Committed to seeing justice served, she will also tell of the maneuvering through the legal system that resulted in a 61 year prison sentence for the abuser. She will give updates on domestic violence statistics and tell how her faith helped her through this ordeal.

NOVEMBER 16: Vicki Tapia, Retired Lactation Specialist, will share "Dementia Awareness." Vicki will share her personal stories of the dementia journey she traveled with her parents, along with excerpts from her book, "Somebody Stole My Iron." She'll also discuss early warning signs and symptoms of dementia as well as the importance of early diagnosis, which is key to helping patients live better day-to-day with this disease.

NOVEMBER 23 Ruben and Vanessa Bossombian, students at Rocky Mountain College will share, "Our Country, the Ivory Coast." Brother and sister Ruben and Vanessa will tell of the history of their country, their country's dependence on agriculture, programs to fight infectious diseases, and the main religions in the Ivory Coast. They will also tell of their journey that brought them to Billings and Rocky Mountain College.
