This Sunday is "big game" Sunday and many Americans will gather around their television sets enjoying the fellowship of friends, eating lots of food, and either cheering for or against the Seattle Seahawks or the New England Patriots. Did you know that this Sunday is the second biggest day of the year for food consumption in the United States (Thanksgiving is the biggest)? I read a post online this week that estimated that: 5,000 pounds of hot dogs will be sold during the game, 49.2 million cases of beer will be sold on that day, 1.23 billion chicken wings will be eaten, 8 million pounds of guacamole will be eaten and 14,500 tons of chips will be consumed. That's amazing isn't it?

And yet, in the midst of all the consumption there are nearly 50 million Americans who live in poverty, more than 630,000 people in the U.S. are homeless, 23% of those struggling went to college, and that 16 million children live in food insecure households. (www.feedingamerica.org and www.endhomelessness.org) These are staggering statistics! So what do we do about this?

I do not wish to guilt you and keep you from enjoying the football game and eating with friends; rather I share this so that we are mindful of the reality before us. As we enjoy this Sunday and participate in the statistics of food consumption, we also should pray for those who do not have the privilege of eating a meal. We need to pray about intentional ways for us to be a proactive part of the solution of hunger in the name of Christ. While we cannot solve the issue of hunger for all people we can make a difference in the lives of a few. May we be living sacrifices as we seek to honor and serve our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who sacrificed all for us!
