IT'S A MATTER OF FAITH!

F IS FOR FORGIVENESS

We cannot have eternal life and heaven without God's FORGIVENESS.

Ephesians 1:7a - "In Him we have redemption through his blood, and the forgiveness of sins."

A IS FOR AVAILABLE

Forgiveness is available.

It is - Available for ALL. John 3:16 - "For God so Loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Luke 13:3 -

Turn to Someone; trust Christ only. Romans 10:9 - "if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe it in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

H IS FOR HEAVEN

Heaven is eternal life.

Here and Hereafter. John 14:3 - "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

How can a person have God's forgiveness, heaven, eternal life and Jesus as personal Savior and Lord? By trusting in Christ and asking Him for forgiveness.

MONDAY FaceTime

The Early Church

Part 1– Evangelism

One of the more remarkable things in history is the success of Christianity. Think about it, a small group of insignificant and uneducated people transformed human history through a simple message. The early church was not rich nor did they have political or military power. This week we will be looking at how a small group of people living in ancient Palestine shaped Western Civilization and transformed the direction of history. In doing so, hopefully we can reflect on how we might be able to apply some of the same principles found in scripture so that we can carry on the Jesus movement. Today we will be looking at the evangelistic nature of the early church.

Acts 1:8, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in <u>Jerusalem</u>, and in all <u>Judea</u> and <u>Samaria</u>, and to the <u>ends of the earth</u>."

1. Early Growth - Read: Acts 2:41,47

As we can clearly see the early church experienced tremendous growth early on. Peter preached about the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ and the Jews responded. He also placed the blame for Jesus' execution on those listening and called for repentance. In other words, Peter shared the whole Gospel.

What was the result of Peter's sermon?

2. More Growth

Throughout the book of Acts there are several examples of how the church shared the Gospel and as a result people came to Christ to be saved.

Read: Acts 4:4 - What was the result of faithful evangelism?

Read: Acts 4:12 - This verse is a snapshot of the message the apostle shared.

Read: 4:33 - How did the apostles share their faith in Christ?

Read: 5:14 - How often was the church sharing the Gospel? How often were people being converted?

Read: Acts 5:42 - When and where was the church sharing the Gospel?

Read: Acts 6:1,7 -What was the result?

3. Reflection

Take a few minutes and personally reflect on the questions below. What can we learn form the early church in regards to evangelism?

What can you personally do to be more faithful in regards to sharing the Gospel?

The nature of the early church could be characterized by four core values made up of the Word of God, fellowship, worship, and prayer. They were a community that revered God, was unified, and served each other. The church was a body not a building that eagerly met corporately for evangelism and privately for discipleship. The early church was passionate about sharing the Gospel, and for this reason, the Lord gave them a successful harvest.

The Early ChurchPart 4 - A Look at Peter

Today we will be looking at some snapshots of Peter's life from Acts chapters 1-12.

1.Peter's 1st Sermon - Acts 2:14-41

Read Acts 2:36. In his sermon, what did Peter say in regards to Jesus' identity?

Read Acts 2:37. How did the crowd respond to Peter's message?

Read Acts 2:38-39. How did Peter instruct the crowd to respond to the Gospel? (Remember, baptism is not required for salvation. However, it is the proper response by someone who has been saved.)

2. Peter's 2nd Sermon - Acts 3:11-26

Read Acts 3:19. As Peter preached the Gospel what two things were essential in order to be saved?

3. Peter's 3rd Sermon - Acts 4:8-12

Read Acts 4:10. What two essential things did Jesus do that leads to spiritual healing/salvation?

Read Acts 4:12. According to Peter, who is the only person that can offer eternal salvation?

4. Peter's 4th Sermon - Acts 5:29-32

Read Acts 5:30. According to Peter what are the essential elements of the Gospel? It may help to compare this verse with Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 15:1-4.

5. Peter's 5th Sermon - Acts 10:34-43

Read Acts 10:27-29. Up to this point Peter's audience has been exclusively Jewish. In fact, the first Christians were Jewish Christians. Who is Peter's audience in this passage?

Read Acts 10:39-41. What message did Peter make sure he shared with the this group?

6. Reflection

How committed was Peter to preaching the Gospel?

According to Peter, what did Jesus do that made salvation possible?

How can we learn to have Peter's passion in regards to sharing the message of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection?
