

50 YEARS OF FAITHFUL SERVICE AND STEWARDSHIP IN THE PASTORAL MINISTRY

"This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the mysteries God has revealed. Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful." I Corinthians 4:1-2

The following documentary contains accounts from various members of the Fairview Church Family on the 50th Pastoral Anniversary Celebration of Pastor John Arethaus Reed, Jr., and Sister Patricia R. Reed. In some instances, the writer will be noted; in others, information will be merged. Contributors include: Tamara Derrick, Marveda Stinson, Taressa Gaines, Cora Epps, C. Meldon Hardrick, and Maeleatha Patterson, Editor.

The journey began when former Fairview Pastor, the late Dr. S. S. Fairly, contacted Rev. J. A. Reed, Jr., and informed him that the congregation had voted to have him (Rev. Reed) serve as Assistant Pastor at Fairview. On the second Sunday in January 1963, Reverend Reed and his wife, Pat, were presented to the congregation.

The second Sunday of January, 2013, marked 50 years to the date that Reverend John A. and Patricia Reed began their journey at Fairview. From January 13, 1963 to January 13, 2013, 50 years, they have served as Shepherd and helpmate to the church family. The longevity of this union, Pastor and church, is one that few have been able to witness. So, we celebrated!

It was only fitting that the commencement of the celebration would replicate the reason for the celebration. On the second Sunday in January, 2013, a special worship service was held with Pastor Reed preaching from the Anniversary Theme, "50 Years of Faithful Service and Stewardship in the Pastoral Ministry," I Corinthians 4:1-2. The call went out to all members and former members that were a part of the congregation during the year of the Reeds arrival, 1963, to be in attendance on January 13, 2013. They responded and the center aisle was filled. A special plaque was presented to the Pastor. The service was coordinated by Fairview's Black History Ministry.

The entire month of March was spent celebrating. It started on Sunday March 3, with the visitation of Pastor Larry Mouton from the Pleasant Mt. Gilead Baptist Church, Ft. Worth, Texas. A large contingent from the church traveled with him. Reverend Reed had served at PMG in 1963, prior to coming to Fairview.

Sunday night, Fairview's Music and Fine Arts Ministry presented a Celebratory Musical with a lineup of special guests, including Reverend Dr. J. P. Dennis and the Dennis Family from Wichita, Kansas. The following is a recap from Tamara Derrick:



The Musical Tribute to Dr. and Mrs. J. A. Reed, Jr., held on March 3, 2013, was unlike any other. This was not a typical sit-back and enjoy the musical type. It was a mixture of family and friends coming together in song to pay tribute to a man who has meant so much in their lives.

Sandra Thompson, Frankye Johnson, Jacqueline Devereaux, Josef Rolack and Anttwain Cox all shared their experiences as musicians at Fairview. Songs were rendered from Fairview Baptist Church combined choir, New Union Baptist Church Choir. Solos were given by Bertick Bailey, minister James Willis, and Velina Davenport. A praise dance was performed by the FBC Young Adult Praise Dancers.

Dr. J. P. Dennis, a long-time friend of Dr. Reed, gave some loving remarks to the beloved Pastor. [In addition to his words to Pastor, he, through the

working of the Holy Spirit, powerfully lifted one of his favorite hymns.] To end the musical, the Dennis Family, a group of siblings who sing together, put on their own mini concert. They are the children of Dr. Dennis, who himself celebrated his 50 year anniversary in August of 2012.



Sunday, March 10, Reverend H. B. Charles, Jr., Pastor of Shiloh Metropolitan Baptist Church, Jacksonville, Florida, was the preacher for the 10:00 a.m. Worship Period. Marveda Stinson recounts:

"Which do you choose "Sand v. Rock?" Rev. Charles taught us how to have a life that is built to last. First and foremost, we need to build on a firm foundation and be doers of the Word. The Word of God is Indestructible; so is a child of God. WARNING: Matthew 7, verse 27: Those that build on sand will fall. Foolish people believe they can build without a firm foundation, wise people build on the rock!

Remember, faith does not excuse you from trouble; life that last is tested by severe storms. Storms are inevitable; trust and believe at some point the storm

will cease. Trouble will not last always. Psalm 30, verse 5, God's favor is for life and He is a God of second chances. If there is something in your life that you know is not pleasing to God, tear it down and build again. Which foundation do you choose, Sand or Rock?

There were many on program to pay tribute, including Sheriff Wetzel, The Sons of Fairview, Senator Connie Johnson, Representative Mike Shelton, Representative Anastasia Pitman, and County Commissioner Willa Johnson.

Sharing memories from their childhood, Pastor's cousin recalled that they all played Church as kids and that Pastor ALWAYS wanted to play the Preacher. Other family members were in attendance for the celebration from Texas, Maryland, California and Nevada.

The well wishes for Rev. and Sis. Reed were numerous, echoing so many memories and sentiments such as:

He has meant so much to so many, Servant, and Inspirational intermediary, , He displays the essential elements to greatness: Humility, Selflessness, Courage,

A friend to preachers and a friend to humanity at large,

Romans 1:16 sums up the ministry of Pastor Reed; "For I am not ashamed,"

A Leader's Leader and a Preacher's Preacher, What a man, what a man, what a mighty good man.

Tough but encouraging and honest; A beacon for all!

The Sons of Fairview poked a little fun at pastor in a short roast fashioned after Red Neck Comedy. Sample comments were: If you have held every office and presided over every organization in the state of Oklahoma, you might be John Reed. If you like firing musicians and then hiring them back, you might be John Reed. It was too much fun.

Everyone acknowledges that behind every good man is a good woman and Sis. Pat is that good woman. She was also honored as First Lady and Queen. Sis. Pat expressed her gratefulness to God and her continued commitment to pray for Pastor and stand with him. It was a wonderful evening and Pastor was especially happy that First Lady was able to stand with him."

March 17, 10:00 a.m., Reverend Reginald Payne, Pastor of Full Gospel Baptist Church, Los Angeles preached. Marveda Stinson gives her review of the message:

Proverbs 15, verse 28: The heart of the righteous studies how to answer, but the mouth of the wicked pours forth evil. Criticism will come and, oh, yes, there will be "hater's". People will grumble and complain when you do what is asked of you by God. Criticism will come from all around. Critics like to be around others who will reinforce their views.

Talk and pray to God like Nehemiah and God will handle the situation. God wants to draw us closer to him. Rev. Payne pointed out that criticism can demoralize and discourage us. There is hope; we are not destroyed or forsaken. If we serve the Lord, it will pay off. Rev. Payne said it best, "Knocked Down But Not Knocked Out."

Taressa Gaines added of Rev. Payne's message:

In celebrating the longevity of Pastor John A. Reed Jr., Rev. Reginald Payne preached from Nehemiah 4:1–8, a message entitled "Knocked Down But Not Knocked Out." He described Pastor Reed as a hero in the ministry, and also wanted the congregation to

know there is a cost to being a leader of any kind in the world today. Criticism is going to come no matter what you do. It's how you react to the criticism that will determine your path. Pastor Reed has married, buried, baptized, and evangelized for the Fairview Family, but within these past 50 years he is still met with criticism.

Pastor Payne wanted the

congregation to know that when in a leadership position, opposition is inevitable, but prayer must be the first thing you do when met with criticism. For leaders to be successful, they must have good workers and the leaders must pray for their workers so they do not become weary. Nehemiah talked to God when met with opposition. He prayed for his workers and, most importantly, did not get deterred from building the wall around Jerusalem like God had commanded. Thank God for Pastor Reed's 50 years with Fairview, his intensity to pray criticism away, and his love for the community and congregation.

Sunday night, March 17, Reverend Joe Carter, Pastor of New Hope Baptist Church in Newark, New Jersey, along with members of New Hope and his family, formed Joe Carter and Company and presented a highly spiritual Musical Tribute that "brought the house down." People came from across the city to be a part of the worship celebration. It was as if someone had put the word out that we were having a Fairview Reunion. Many faces were seen, ministers and laypersons, that had been members of or affiliated with Fairview from the days "in the red church" to present. Tamara Derrick added:

Pastor Carter reminisced about the impact that Rev. Reed had on him while he was at Fairview and even still to this day. The choir sang an assortment of praise songs as well as a song from Sam Cooke, one of Rev. Reed's favorite artists.

At the end of their worship period, Rev. Carter called for a period of prayer. One by one, members of the audience approached the altar, embracing each other as Rev. Carter offered up petitions on behalf of the Pastor, Sister Reed, and the people. Rev. Brandon McCray of Kansas was also present and Rev. Carter requested that he close the evening with a saxophone solo.

Tuesday through Friday nights, March 19—22, churches from throughout the city came to share with Fairview in honoring the Shepherd. The lineup of preachers included, in nightly order, Reverends Mike Woodberry, Pastor of Unity Baptist Church; Ricky Patton, Pastor of Holy United Baptist Church; E. Jennings Tyson, Pastor of New Hope Baptist Church; and L. A. Kessee, Pastor of Bethany Baptist Church of West Los Angeles, California. Each night Fairview Ministries that were listed as sponsor were responsible for a presentation, depicting various decades of Pastor Reed's tenure. It was evident that from 1963 to present, Pastor and Sister Reed, have made some lasting impressions upon the membership. Various depictions were done, including mimicking attire, the "Reed" vocabulary, mannerisms and a look down memory lane through photography.

The celebrations ended on Sunday, March 24, with Reverend James E. Reed, Jr., Pastor of Central Baptist Chandler, and biological brother to Dr. Reed, as the morning preacher. Also present was Rev. Gary Hall and

A Son's Confession

The following is an excerpt from Rev. H. B. Charles, Jr.'s Blog, HBC2, at www.hbcharlesjr.com. He commented on his visit to Fairview on March 10, during the Pastor's Anniversary.

It was my privilege to speak during the celebration of the 50 years **Dr. John A. Reed Jr.** has served as Pastor of the Fairview Baptist Church in Oklahoma City.

Pastor Reed was one of my father's closest friends. He was



"Uncle John" to me, when I was a boy.

The morning my father died, I was flying home to Los Angeles. Dr. Reed was flying home from Los Angeles, after preaching a week of meetings at my dad's church. He turned right around and was there for me and with me that week.

After my father's passing, Uncle John became "Pop" to me. He has been a father figure for me throughout my adult life. He ordained me into the ministry. He helped install me into my first congregation. He gave the message at my wedding to Crystal. He counseled me when I was deciding to move to leave my father's church for Jacksonville. He helped install me at Shiloh. For more than 15 years, he let me speak at his church's annual revival.

I often say, "It happens after prayer." It is the title of my upcoming book. That line is the truth I learned from Dr. Reed.

Dr. Reed, his family, and the Fairview Church have been a great source of support and encouragement through the years. And it was an honor to be with them for this special celebration.

Out the pulpits of my two pastorates, there is no congregation I have preached to more over the years than Fairview. It was a homecoming, of sorts. I enjoyed preaching to this word-loving congregation again.

I witnessed something I had never seen in worship before. At the end of the service, Pastor Reed asked for prayer for his ailing wife. Then he admitted to the congregation that her sickness weighed on him and that he desperately needed their prayers. As he was talking, several members left their seats and came to the altar and began to pray for their pastor. Within minutes, several hundred members literally surrounded their pastor in prayer. *That's what it means to cover your pastor!*

After service, a brother thanked me for the live streaming of our worship services at Shiloh. He had surgery and could not attend church for 12 weeks. He got through it, he said, my watching our Sunday morning services. Way cool.

Likewise, a young man came up to me and said, "From a young preacher to an old preacher, thanks for the message." Old preacher? Who, me?



Black History Month is a time to reflect. remember, and celebrate the accomplishments of members of the African American community. The Fairview Missionary Baptist Church Black History Ministry, through the pastoral guidance and vision of Pastor J. A. Reed, Jr., has been instrumental in placing

special emphasis on black history month at Fairview and in the surrounding community.

The Black History Ministry planned a plethora



of events to commemorate this occasion. Special worship periods included the following dynamic guest speakers: Congressman J.C. Watts, Jr., Rev. Ralph Elliot, Dr. Ray A. Owens, and Congressman Emanuel Cleaver, II. Additionally, the Young Adult Ministry sponsored weekly "Who Am I" moments to depict a few, notable figures in

black history, with guest appearances by the Youth Ministry as well. The special screening of "Red Tails" was a showstopper with thrilling scenes portraying the lives of the Tuskegee Airmen, while the movie goers enjoyed free popcorn, hamburgers, hotdogs, and other snacks.

Furthermore, the Black History Ministry and Nurses' Ministry placed special emphasis on health by offering blood pressure screenings and a blood drive. Special appreciation goes to those that attempted and were able to donate blood. With 16 successful donations. Fairview was able to save nearly 50 lives! Moreover, Bruce Fisher, of the Oklahoma Historical Society, presented a powerful black history presentation, which focused on the contributions of African Americans in Oklahoma, that sparked the interest and expanded the knowledge of youth and adults alike.

The month-long celebration culminated with the annual Sunday School Drama Ministry Black History Program, the presentation of the "John A. Reed, Jr. Spirit of the Community Award," and the

Community Black History Month Celebration. This year, the Sunday School Program featured a special guest, former State Representative Kevin Cox. During the morning worship period, the "John A. Reed, Jr. Spirit of the Community Award" was presented to 16 recipients: John A. Reed, Jr., Jimmy Curry, Sharon Dean, Bruce Fisher, Rita McNeal Freeney, David Gray, Blayne E. Hinds, Harlan Jones, Cleo McGlory, Roy Nelson, Tim O'Connor, T. J. Roberts, Sandra Rogers, Barbara Royce, Flossie Thurston, and Sheila Williams. The Community Black History Month Celebration, which is the first community-wide black history celebration, included several ministers and congregations, and featured Congressman Cleaver and the Ambassadors Concert Choir.

On February 24, 2013, the Fairview Baptist Church had the privilege of hearing former State Representative Kevin Cox, District 97, speak on behalf of our Black History. Mr. Cox was the guest speaker for the Sunday School's Black History program.

Kevin Cox who was born in Oklahoma City, OK, has a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science, from Florida A & M University; a Master's degree in Public Administration, University of Georgia.

His concerns include equal importance of Health Care availability; more state and aid in education. Mr. Cox reminded us of how important it is to remember where we came from and how it hasn't been easy. He mentioned a few of the forerunners of our past: Mr. Frederick Doug-

las who was the greatest anti-slavery leader and supported women's rights because he felt they should be treated equally: Mr. Thurgood Marshall, who worked with the NAACP with the concern for equal protection for African Americans in voting, housing, employment, and education.

Our focus should be on encouraging one another as well as giving support to our youth. Statistics give information that make our youth look bad—every 3 hours one killed by a gun, every 9 minutes someone arrested, every 3 minutes a child is born to an unwed mother. What about the great things done by our youth—99% were not expelled, 98% of them are not violate, 99.8% are not doing drugs.

Let's get back to the basic, lets teach our children to read, write, and count their money.





MAKE A WILL PROJECT COMES BACK TO FAIRVIEW

For a fourth year in a row, Fairview members will have the opportunity to participate in the "Make A Will Project," which will allow them to have free wills and other estate planning documents drafted for free by a licensed attorney. It is reported that 80 to 90 percent of African Americans do not "go the extra mile" to protect their wealth by making a simple will. The Make A Will Project seeks to fill this gap.

In connection with the Make A Will Day Program on April 20, 2013, an additional service will be offered to those who attend the Program. For those who are interested, private financial consultations will be offered to those who are interested in increasing returns on assets that they own and adding assets that they currently don't have. The consultations will be conducted by a Financial Management Team ("FMT") that will be comprised of experienced professionals with expertise in the area of finance. Other fields of practice represented on the FMT include the fields of Law, Insurance, Accounting and Securities. The consultations will be offered free of charge.

In order to participate in the program, you must secure a packet from your church coordinator, Erick Harris, on April 14, 2013 after the regular morning worship service. Advance reservations for packets will not be taken and only one packet per household is allowed. Space is extremely limited; therefore members will be served on a first come, first serve basis.

Those requesting a packet should be willing to provide information regarding their financial status and other pertinent information to generate a will and other estate and financial planning documents as needed. In addition, those requesting a packet should be available on April 20, 2013.


