

Patrice Drake has a mission on her heart and that is to



mentor women who are incarcerated to let them know that there are people to help them. Her ultimate goal is to encourage incarcerated women through her personal testimony and God's Hope and Encouragement.

With these goals in mind, Patrice set out to visit a young woman incarcerated at the

Mabel Bassett facility. This young woman would be transitioning out of the facility soon, and Patrice went to meet with her prior to her release. When Patrice arrived at the facility something was wrong. On the one hand, she was nervous and almost frozen; unable to move in the parking lot, but on the other hand, Patrice wanted to go in and meet with the young woman.

Patrice had a total-recall moment, as she has spent 15 years of her life in this facility at one time. This 15-year history colored her memories, bringing up her recall of the pat downs and the strip searches and all the anxiety of these. She relived that feeling of total despair she originally felt.

This was a bitter/sweet moment as she was able to visit some of the facility workers she knew. Patrice had been active in Mabel Basset as a charter member of the Faith and Character Program, where she became familiar with more of the facility personnel and garnered the respect of the staff.

The walk back inside Mabel Bassett brought Patrice full circle to the place that had held her captive. It was a very humbling experience and the emotions that rushed over her were a bit unexpected. But she lives in the blessing of her freedom today and has God's faithfulness as her testimony to share. Knowing that God's will is that she share that testimony, she was able to get past her anxiety to speak into the lives of others traveling the road she has now left behind. God gave her a vision of walking out of Mabel Bassett. At the time, she didn't realize this vision wasn't an instant deliverance, but rather a journey. Once past the realization that she was not shackled in hand cuffs, the anxiety left her and the friendships with the people she grew to know and the love she felt for them flooded over her, and her goal of returning with a testimony was realized.



morning of September 20 continued our month long celebration of activities orchestrated by our Family Enrichment Ministry, led by Brother Larry and Sister Cora Epps. As we entered the Donald Burns Fellowship Hall, we were warmly greeted. (Considering the magnificent planning and detailed execution, one may wonder if this couple spent months of personal hours coordinating this wonderful weekend event!!)

After a full course bounteous breakfast, Pastor Reed extended greetings and stated he was overjoyed by the growth of this 10th Annual Retreat. He gave special thanks to Brother Larry and Sister Cora for presenting the idea to bring married couples, seniors and singles together for the first time to share in this year's retreat. First Lady Pat sent a message of encouragement and prayers that we would have a weekend of rejuvenation and enjoyment.

Facilitators for the retreat were Pastor Chester and Sis. Regina West-Emmanuel Baptist; Rev. Bob and Sis. Zina Davis-Covenant Life Church and Oklahoma Marriage Initiative; our own Rev. Arthur Crawford, and Rev. Derrick and Shree Walter.

Prior to the retreat weekend, members attending were asked to write a *Love Letter to God*. Several of those letters were shared, reminding us of His awesomeness, the magnitude of His love for us, and His divine presence. To begin Session I, we viewed a segment of the movie "Fire Proof – The Covenant" which portrayed a family in crisis. 40-Day steps were used to reconcile their marriage and brought the family to the realization that they first need to love God.

Rev. and Sis. West presented the topic "Living for the Love of You" with humor and enthusiasm as they drew everyone into the discussion. Several expressions of "what is love" was shared: love is unconditional, love is not what is said-but what it does; love is a process-not a product ... "My beloved friends, let us continue to love each other

since love comes from God. Everyone who loves is born of God and experiences a relationship with God. The person who refuses to love doesn't know the first thing about God, because God is love—so you can't know him if you don't love." I John 4:7-8 (MSG)

Our Singles and Couples assembled separately in Session II. "Love/Infatuation" was the topic for the Singles, facilitated by Rev. and Sis. Davis. Rev. and Sis. Walter facilitated the Couples' session – "Joy & Pain-Divorce is Not An Option." Statistics record that Oklahoma is #3 in divorce rate, with the top five problems listed as Communication, Infidelity/Betrayal, Finances, Psychological, Emotional & Physical Abuse; and Lost of Interest. Sis. Shree gave principles and scriptures for divorce proofing our marriage: Make Christ the center of the marriage; Treat each other with utmost respect, Love being with your spouse; Be careful how you relate to the opposite sex; and Don't keep secrets.

We were treated to a lavish lunch and allowed time to fellowship before our 26-passenger bus and several vehicles traveled to Gore, OK. Once you adjust to the up-hill drive and winding roads, The Fin & Feather Resort is located near Lake Tenkiller in quite a scenic and serene rural setting. After settling in our cabins or the hotel, we had approximately two hours to rest or tour the grounds before the next session.

In Session III, Rev. Derrick and Sis. Shree continued our Couples discussion on "Divorce Is Not An Option-Infidelity & Sexual Healing."
