My beloved members,

We are being blessed as a Church Family as we continue our

focus on Christian Stewardship. We have been taught that the first principle of stewardship is this: God is owner, and we are stewards. God owns everything; we are His tenants. We are accountable to Him for the use of His gifts.

Christian Stewardship is the practice of systematic and proportionate giving of time, abilities, and material possessions, based on the

Growing in Christ means to live on less and to save and invest more than ten percent and to contribute far more than ten percent to the church for the work of the Kingdom of God. Getting the point across to church members about stewardship responsibilities is very difficult. As your Pastor, I have dedicated my ministry to teaching Christian concepts about giving to new disciples and to open-minded disciples.

New Christians need to know that stewardship improves as stewards learn to trust God for employment, salaries, health, wealth, protection and for God's blessing in every circumstance.

Romen's Conference

As Mitt Romney and President Barak Obama recently began *debating* about options and answers for the success of our country, the Women of Fairview delivered real answers for living and thriving during their annual conference.

Expanding on this year's theme for the church, which is Being The Church Today, the conference theme was "Chosen Women Fulfilling Our Mission as Disciples in the Church Today". The scripture reference for the conference was Matthew 28: 19-20. The "Chosen" women of Fairview brought passion, strength and wisdom in each of their short sessions. The ladies teamed together to address the following conference topics:

- <u>Jo Reed—Women of the Church, Covered or Uncovered</u>. As Galatians 5: 22-23 tells us the FRUIT of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. There is only <u>one</u> fruit, and the Holy Spirit wants to develop all nine qualities of the fruit in us.
- Eboni Johnson—Fashion-forward Women Today:Clothed in the Virtues of Christ. One part of our daily routine is to shower and select clean clothes to put on. As Christian women it is our duty to CHOOSE to clothe ourselves in these garments or these nine qualities. We must also accessorize by putting on forgiveness and love.
- <u>Clara Finley—Chosen Women Fulfilling Our Mission.</u> CHOSEN = preference, picked out. Clara shared the stories of many women of the bible; Mary, Martha, Tabitha, Gomer, Abigail, Hannah, Ruth as examples of chosen women fulfilling a mission. Prayer was and is the key.
- <u>Tracy Banks—The Elect Lady, 2John1:5</u>. She shared with us that without love, ANY work we do means *nothing*.
- <u>Dr Teresa Hunter</u> educated the group on Clinical Depression. She encouraged us to get a mental health check if we experience intense feelings of sadness or hopelessness. Only 1 in 3 will actually seek treatment because mental health is often minimized and/or some feel treatment may carry a stigma.

The keynote speaker was Ramona Dindy of Greater Mt. Olive Baptist Church. She is the former president of East Zion District Young Adult and the Mt Olive

Young Adults. Her motto is if she can help somebody, then her living will not be in vain. This helps us to know Sis Dindy has a real passion to help others.

Sis Ramona Dindy reminded us that each of us was chosen by God to make disciples. (Disciple means learner of God)



Even though we are chosen, we must also choose God deliberately. She also shared what is *wrong* with our witness:

- Mixed messages—people see us attending to church but complaining about going;
- We have memo-

rized the word but have not internalized it;

- Not living the Christian life but live like hell at home;
- Judging others and not showing the love of Christ;
- Working on "church programs" but walking by people hurting and in need;

The Challenge

Sis Dindy told us not to compare ourselves with others, but rather to measure up to the word of God. Live the Life outside of the church walls and as you go about your day, minister to someone and make disciples. It is not about beating people over the head with scriptures. First build a relationship with the person, share sermons and how it has changed your life. Show love and share with others God's grace and mercy. Sis Dindy challenged us to think of 3 people who are not saved. Write down their names and pray for the opportunity to witness to them and to show them the love of Christ.

The Culinary Ministry as usual served a wonderful lunch for the ladies. We are blessed with lots of talent. During lunch Jackie Rogers and Phyllis Reece raffled off the many prizes to the ladies. We appreciate their time and energy to select and collect nice gifts so that every woman could be a winner.

(November Prayer Focus- Prayer Group #11)

Genesis 50:15-20- "When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, perhaps Joseph will hate us, and may actually repay us for all the evil which we did to him. So they sent messengers to Joseph, saying, before your father died he commanded, saying, "Therefore, you shall say to Joseph: "I beg you, please forgive the trespass of your brothers and their sin; for they did evil to you." "Now, please, forgive the trespass of the servants of the God of your father." And Joseph wept when they spoke to him. Then his brothers also went and fell down before his face. and they said, "Behold, we are your servants." Joseph said to them, "Do not be afraid, for am I in the place of God? But as for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as it is this day, to save many people alive."

Joseph, with a great deal of compassion, confirms his reconciliation and affection to his brothers." He directs his brothers to look up to God in their repentance (Verse 19), "Am I in the place of God? Make your peace with God, and then you will find it an easy matter to make your peace with me". Joseph attempts to lessen the magnitude of his brothers fault, from the consideration of the great good which God wonderfully brought out of it. which, though it should not make them less sorry for their sins, yet it made Joseph the more willing to forgive his brothers sinful act towards him. God often brings good out of evil, and promotes the designs of His wisdom (providence) even by the sins of men, however, by no means are we saying that God is the author of sin, Oh no saints!...we are far from that kind of thinking, however, God's infinite wisdom so overrules events, that, in our daily lives and the evil issues we encounter, that

is actually ends in His praise which in its own nature had a direct tendency to *his* dishonor; as the putting of Christ to death, (Acts 2:23.)

Consequently, it is so easy for us to treat others identical to the old "nasty" ways before we became saved or show animosity to those who offend us. And there are moments when others seem unscrupulous, deceptive, wicked, and even feeling victimized by family members or a spouse, stop! And seek God! God can transform your situation... amen! It is only by seeking God through prayer that you will experience God's healing power of forgiveness. However, as saints of God, we must forgive as Christ has died and paid the awesome price for our sins. We are sanctified by our Lord and Savior Christ Jesus to forgive.

Therefore, we must always find a place and time of stillness to seek God through prayer and healing through his Word. God's word teaches us his laws and instructions on how to forgive those who seem unforgiveable. And, as we seek God, let us pray for each of our lives to be a testimony of God's power to transform our character as **believers of Jesus Christ.** Amen!

Now...let's pray! God help us to have a heart of love and forgiveness. We want to feel your blessed assurance as we seek you God for your healing continuance of love, so that we can become stronger in our relationships with others and even in our daily walk with you Lord Jesus; help us to act in kindness to all men... in Jesus name, Amen!

Celebrating the Survivors

The 9th Annual Cancer Survivor Tea sponsored by Dee Wilder was held on October 10 at 1:00 pm. The theme was **Strength**, **Courage Hope and Faith**.

Rev. Cleo McGlory opened the celebration with prayer and the occasion was delivered by inspirational words from Carolyn Peters. Fairview's ladies of LIFT ministered His word by dancing to My Life Is In Your Hands, by Kirk Franklin.

The Healing Garden was a beautiful venue with beautiful plants, fountains and landscaping. The speaker for the event was former Lt Governor Jeri Askins who shared with the group detailed information about the design of the facility and its approach for care and nurturing of the patients and their families.

Normally held at Fairview, this year the tea was in the Healing Garden of the Peggy ad Charles Stephenson Cancer Center at the University of Oklahoma on NE 10th Street. This center will be among the first in the

world to offer proton therapy with a smaller first-of-its-kind system newly approved by the FDA. The Mevion S250 Proton Therapy System provides the same precise, non-invasive treatment advantages and capabilities of the large and costly proton systems, but with higher patient volume and improved reliability and lower implementation and operational costs.

Cancer survivors in the audience were introduced and celebrated by the number of years they have been healed. Sis Dee Wilder is a three-time survivor. The mother of sisters Phyllis Reece and Jackie Rogers is a 27-year survivor. Monica Wilder acknowledged each survivor in a special way.

Fairview's Culinary Ministry went to great lengths to make the day special providing a variety of teas and finger foods, and even transporting china dinnerware to the Stephenson Center for the event.

After an exciting raffle for a ladies Coach purse, a group of the ladies completed a tour of the impressive, state-of-the-art facility.

MEN'S MINISTRY FELLOWSHIP DINNER/ CLARENCE WILDER FISH FRY HELD

"For over 60 years, the men of Fairview have given the Church Family 'a night out' with an evening of fellowship and food. Tuesday night, February 22, was no exception, in spite of the rain, sleet, and snow." This excerpt was taken from an article printed in the March 1994 issue of *The Fairviewan*.

On Tuesday night, October 16, 2012, a tradition that started around 75 years ago was once again portrayed. The men of Fairview treated the church family to an evening of food and fellowship.

Different formats for the evening's program have been witnessed by this writer during my 35-year tenure at Fairview, but each brings about the same result—everyone leaves grateful for the evening shared with family, friends and in fellowship. There have been some years that the ladies of the church would dress in their best and would be provided with entertainment of the men's choice. This year's agenda included a setup for the diners to watch the second Presidential Debate between President Barack Obama and Governor Mitt Romney.

The October 16 agenda was a relaxed, come and go affair. The men once again, bought the food, prepared it, served it with a smile, and cleaned up afterwards! There were ladies from the Culinary Ministry that assisted. The food was delicious, which included a full course with desert—definitely fried fish is now a most, in honor of the late Clarence Wilder.

In 1994, I had the privilege of interviewing Deacon Roy Nelson, one of Fairview's long-time members, to get some background on the Fellowship Dinner. At that time it was referred to as the Annual Brotherhood Dinner. According to Brother Nelson, the men of the church began this event shortly after Pastor S. S. Fairly arrived and they had not missed a year, regardless of the economy. "Times were hard," said Brother Nelson. "It was during the depression and Pastor Fairly and the men felt this would be an opportunity to give people a good meal and bring the church together." As now, the men bought the food, prepared it, and served it.
