FAIRVIEW HOSTS STATE CONGRESS JUNE 4-7

Dr. John A. Reed, Jr. and the Fairview Baptist Church served as host to the 106th Annual Session of the Oklahoma Baptist State Congress of Christian Education.

This year's theme was "Solidarity With the Savior Through Our Worship." The Congress is the educational arm of the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention and is responsible for teaching and training classes covering every aspect of Christian Education. Rev. Donald Dumas, Pastor of Dean's Chapel Baptist Church in Muskogee, is the President of the State Congress and Dr. C. W. Whitlow of Union Baptist, Lawton, is Convention President.

The session opened on Monday night with a Musical and Welcome Program. Elected officials addressing the body included State Representative for District 99, Anastasia Pittman, State Representative for District 97 Mike Shelton, State Senator Constance Johnson, Ward 7 City Councilman Ronald Skip Kelly and Oklahoma County Commissioner, District 1, Willa Johnson.

Members of Fairview's Music Ministry were a part of the dynamic choir that presented Monday night's musical. Sister Velina Davenport, Director of Music for the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention, was chief director and was assisted by musicians and directors from the East Zion Consolidated District Association.

The Session officially opened on Tuesday morning. Approximately 300 adults and children took advantage of the classes that were presented. Throughout the session, delegates had the opportunity to be fed through the preaching of some of the state's greatest proclaimers, such as Rev. Granville Jett, Rev. Rodney Stamps, Rev. Rodger Cutter, Rev. Kelly Booker, Rev. Bryson Smith and Rev. Racilus (Ray) Douglas, Jr. Rev. Donald Dumas, Congress President, gave his Annual Message on Wednesday night. A highlight of the week was the work of the Prison Ministry which resulted in two souls being led to Christ at the Worship Service held at the Oklahoma City Community Corrections Center, 315 West I–44 Service Road. The candidates were baptized at Fairview during Wednesday night's service.

The Congress closed on Thursday with the Commencement and Children and Youth Rally. Dr. Major Jemison, Pastor of St. John Missionary Baptist Church and Past President of the Progressive National Baptist Convention, gave the Commencement Message. Brother BerThaddeus Bailey, winner of the State Oratorical Presentation, brought the listeners to their feet as he spoke on the theme, "Building a Solid Life with the Savior," I Corinthians 3:9. Brother Bailey went on to present at the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education in St. Louis, Missouri, and was deemed the National winner!

Fairview is to be commended for the work done in serving as host. Throughout the week, the delegates gave acclaim to the hospitality shown by those that volunteered during the week. Job well done!

107TH NATIONAL CONGRESS ST LOUIS, MISSOURI

Fairview was among over 17,000 registered delegates that attended this year's 107th Annual Session

of the National Baptist **Congress of Christian Education** held in St. Louis, Missouri, June 18-22. The Congress serves as the primary training arm of the 7.5 million member National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc., of which Dr. Julius R. Scruggs is President and Fairview's own Dr. J. A. Reed, Jr. is Western Region Vice President. Dr George W. Waddles, Sr. is



Congress President and Dr. Elliott Cuff is Congress Dean.

Delegates were able to select study from a slate of 300 classes. The week's structure offered uplifting celebratory worship experiences and events with the opportunity to engage in fellowship and study with Christians from across the nation.

National Congress Report by C. Meldon Hardrick

I was blessed to have been able to attend the recently held 107th Session of the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education, held in St. Louis, Missouri the week of June 18-22.

Dr. Julius R. Scruggs of Alabama is the President of The National Baptist Convention USA Incorporated (NBC USA Inc.), and the Training Congress, which is the education arm of NBC USA Inc. The theme for this year's session was: "Solidarity with the Savior Through our Worship".

I write from my experiences that I had there, for it's far too great a task to try to write about all of the activity that occurred during the Congress.

The official delegate count was listed as 25,000 and I saw a goodly portion of that number, but to show you what a daunting task it is from a reporting standpoint, I did not even get to see all of the Fairview Delegation while there. My hotel was at the Airport, roughly 13 miles from downtown St. Louis and far away from the Convention Center Headquarters which was the Edward Jones Domed Stadium. I registered with the Laymen's Division which was headquartered at my Airport Hotel of residence.

I enrolled in one of the seminars entitled, **"Biblical Manhood".** The facilitators were Bro. Isaac Hill from Virginia and National Laymen President Harold L. Simmons from Kansas. Both were outstanding in their presentations. In addition to

about many things that I was familiar with, The Holy Spirit allowed me to gain new knowledge about many, many things that I was not familiar with. I came away feeling that I was filled with the Holy Spirit and am still turning over in my spirit, many of the things that I learned. Prayer Ministry

"Seek God on behalf of the poor for God to establish them; that their spiritual and physical needs are met." (June Prayer Focus-Prayer Group #7)

Psalm 140:2 reads *I* know that the Lord will maintain the cause of the afflicted and justice for the poor.

David seals this prayer by turning his thoughts to the providential judgments of God. Doubtful prayer is no prayer at all. David declares it to be a thing known that God cannot but deliver the afflicted. While God may allow or suffer good and upright persons to be grievously tried, David suggests that God does so advisedly, that he may relieve those who are afflicted, and recover those who are oppressed. He says in express words that he will be the judge of the poor and the afflicted. In this way he encourages the afflicted undergoing continued troubles until the time for deliverance arrives. Though a person may be considered an object of pity in being exposed to the fury of the wicked, he will not give way to despair, but remember that it was the very part of God to undertake the cause of the poor.

Let's get involved in the lives of the less fortunate, and tell them about Jesus, His grace and His mercy toward us. We all have to overcome obstacles in life. At times our faith is weak and our hearts burdened. God is the source and He is the finisher of our faith. If you have faith and confidence in God, that can go a long way in delivering us from discouragement. All of our steps are ordered by the Lord through His word.

<u>1 John 3: 17-19</u>—But whoso hath this world's good and seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion for him, how dwelleth the love of God in him? My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in truth.

<u>Proverbs 14:31, 21:13, 28:27</u>—He that oppresses the poor reproacheth his Maker: but he that honoureth him hath mercy on the poor. Whoso stoppeth his ears at the cry of the poor, he also shall cry himself, but shall not be heard. He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.



When she was able, she attended Brother Bob's Adult #4 Sunday School Class. Even with her handicap, she would climb those stairs to help us build our Church Library.

She was gifted in arts and crafts. There were many of our senior members who received those beautiful afghans, and as soon as she would hear that a new baby was on the way in the family, she would go full speed ahead to the hobby shop to pick out a specific kind of yarn to make those beautiful baby blankets.

But she could also be a very stern, precise, forthright person. She believed in letting you know her thoughts on a particular subject. ... But underneath that stern face was the biggest and kindest heart.

For it is said that the good we do during our lives endures long after we're gone.

We will miss her but we know she's in a better place.

We were blessed to have had her in our lives.
