The third Sunday concluded the weekend Marriage Retreat in



**R** ev. Manuel Scott, Jr. preached a sermon that all can relate to. His subject was "Issues, Issues, Issues," taken from Mark 5: 25-34.



This scripture tells us of

a woman who suffered from constant bleeding for 12 years. She consulted doctor after doctor, spending all of her money seeking a remedy, but instead her condition became worse. Hearing about Jesus, this woman pressed through the crowds of people to get to Him. Her goal was to just touch the hem of His garment to get her healing. She touched Him and was healed immediately.

Seek comfort in knowing that by turning our issues over to Jesus, He will either resolve or dissolve them. Rev. Scott points out three aspects or dimensions this scripture has for everyday life in dealing with our issues. Key factors for us to focus on are:

#### Dimension One—Internal

Just as the woman in the scripture was bleeding internally, many issues we deal with are internal: (envy, resentment, hatred, jealousy). If these issues remain unchecked, they will turn into more serious issues.

#### Dimension Two—External

In our story, the woman had external obstacles in terms of the crowds she had to press her way through to get to Jesus. We deal with many external obstacles (family, co-workers, friends, sorority/fraternity, etc.). We will have more issues if we allow people to keep us from getting close to Jesus (verse 27) and touching His garment. <u>Your friends and loved ones can't get</u> you into Heaven, but they can take you to hell.

#### Dimension Three-Eternal

The woman had faith that a touch from Jesus would heal her. When she touched Him in verse 30, Jesus knew that power had gone out of Him. Touching Jesus in faith equals Power Benefits, which in turn means you will be made whole. Jesus shed His blood for each and everyone of our issues. Have faith and believe. Jesus is a issue resolver and dissolver.

The event theme was "Marriage: Mission Possible" (M:P:9), a play on the Mission Impossible movie and TV show. Our scripture message came from <u>Luke: 18-27</u> **"What is impossible for man, is possible** with God."

The retreat kicked off at Fairview in the Fellowship Hall with a great breakfast followed by an amateur video starring Larry and Cora Epps. It continued with a quick skit which starred some of our newlyweds, Ahmad and Sara Kennedy along with Lanita Harris. <u>Psalm 74: 10, 20-23</u> Oh God, how long shall the adversary reproach? Shall the enemy blaspheme thy Holy Name forever?

The Israelites had prayed to God to remember His covenant with them and to come and see the destructive spirit present in the sanctuary and the desecration of the Temple. The Psalmist is wondering how long will God allow the disrespect, criticism, mumbling, complaining and unholy mocking to continue on. The Psalmist called on God to arise and fight against the enemy to extend His right hand to protect and deliver the people just as He did during the Exodus out of Egypt.

Remember the scripture John 15:12 that we love one another as I have loved you. Yes, this is God's command. Yet this solemn agreement, this very pledge is a vow, a promise, an oath, a bond, a pact, a treaty or even a contract that we were once faithful to is slowly becoming the waste place of our own habitation.

Have you ever said "Woe is me?" or "Oh God, how long are you going to let them get away with this?" Do you hear the cry for help or even see the pain? Often our eyes are wide open to the discord in our own house of worship, but our mouths are cemented shut! Remember no prayer, no change.

So let me guess. You probably have not prayed about it, or if you did, let me ask you what kind of prayer was it?

In all circumstances surrounding us, we must remember our enemies are of a spiritual matter. Let's keep it real and focus on the truth. Don't get caught up in deception.

The unspiritual aggressor is probably a sinner saved by grace, and in need of deliverance from their faults, sins and short comings just like our own. So separate the sin of that person from the sinner. (\*forgiveness is easier that way\*)

Much of our time is wasted, energy consumed and injury is brought into being because we squandered ourselves by battling flesh and blood instead of spiritual wickedness.

So in the process of attempting to wrestle each other into defeat, we totally loose our focus and allow the flesh to distract the enemy, power and strength we have in spiritual warfare. This brings us down. The division and discord hurts our families, churches, work places as well as our community.

If we start fighting others, they will certainly be obliged to fight us back. This allows the devil to defeat us with his own schemes. Whatever you face hence forth, make up your mind how to handle conflict. Satan is still our enemy, but sin within us is our challenge and battle.

Remember to humble yourselves and pray. As we surrender ourselves to the obedience of God's love, make war in prayer and peace with those around us. A house divided is a weak link that cannot stand strong in the time of trial.

- Strengthening families and ensuring healthy childhood development;
- Addressing the interrelated problems of homelessness and incarceration, drug addiction and mental illness;
- Creating socio-economic opportunities for women and
- Fostering leadership qualities.

TEEM has always believed that an individual's best chance for achieving long-term success involves obtaining the necessary skills to take responsibility for their lives. The program builds confidence and leadership qualities by providing the proper training for individuals to stay in the work force through *intensive* workshops, two-week job-search assistance and career development courses including:

We, too, live and look forward to that blessed hope, knowing that in the end, there is a prize that awaits us. We will be liberated from bondage and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God!
