Because of our effort, many contacts were made and several people were won to Christ.

In the first few chapters of Acts, we see that the early church blitzed their community. On the day of Pentecost, three thousand people were saved, who in turn moved through Jerusalem like wildfire. The Gospel of Jesus Christ had penetrated the entire community.

For many Christians, the nearest they come to penetrating their community is driving to church in a car on Sunday morning. We come to church and say, "I've done my duty to God." We try to live our testimony rather than speak it. But sooner or later we must speak to people the words of the Gospel. Penetrating the community involves reaching people for Christ.

The early Christians didn't isolate themselves in a corner and talk about doctrine. They got out and saturated their communities with the Gospel.

Fairview, we need to be the congregation that evangelizes 365 days a year. Evangelism ought to be going on all the time. *Fairview, the Lord need a soul-wining church!*

68TH SIMULTANEOUS REVIVAL

The Holy Spirit led Pastor to begin the revival on Wednesday night this year rather than beginning on Tuesday, and the spirit was high as we began. The prayers and praises that were offered on behalf of the revival were fervent and God's presence was felt. The Singing Churchmen Men's Chorus and the JR Inspirational Choir provided the music each night. Rev. Cleo J. McGlory led out with coordinated evangelism efforts and a large number of witnesses took to the streets to spread the word of God.

Our Evangelist this year was the Reverend Vernon Graves from Jackson, Mississippi. Pastor Graves formerly was the Shepherd of the Ebenezer Baptist Church here in Oklahoma City.

My recollection of him is that he was always a powerful, dynamic Preacher, but this year he rose to new heights in delivering three soul stirring messages.

On Wednesday night, he told us to **"Turn It Over To Jesus"**, using John 2:1-5 as the text.

On Thursday evening, he told us that **"The Sufficiency of Grace"**, was able to sustain us through all of our trails and tribulations. God gave him this message using <u>II Corinthians 12:9</u> as the text.

Friday evening he was at his powerful best as he told us his story and he wanted to know **"What's Your Story?"** He once again went into the New Testament book of John 5:1-12 as he told us his story of how Jesus Christ had picked him up out of the miry clay and set his feet on solid ground.

Later that same evening, Fairview was host to the Late Night Service, and from Fairfield, California, one of my favorite young preachers, Rev. Claybon Lea, Jr. stood behind the sacred desk and inspired us once more with a scintillating message to **"Encourage Yourself"** using <u>I Samuel 30:6b</u> as his text. David encouraged himself in the Lord his God, and so should we. Rev. Lea serves as Vice-

President at Large under Rev. Dr. John A. Reed, Jr., who leads the Western Region of the NBA-USA Inc., under Dr. Julius Scruggs.

The Mass final service for the revival was held at the St. John Missionary Baptist Church as usual. However the scheduled speaker for that occasion was unable to appear. God always has a ram in the bush, and it was necessary this year to avail our selves of the services of that "RAM IN THE BUSH". The powers that be extended an invitation to Rev. Bertrain Bailey, of the St. John Baptist of Dallas, Texas to fill that spot. Young "Choo-Choo" Bailey, as he is nick-named, did not disappoint as he delivered a powerful message which he entitled "The Love that Never Fails". His text was I Corinthians 13:8. This chapter in the New Testament is known as the "love chapter" and was appropriate for the message that was rendered that afternoon. Rev. Bailey is one of America's promising up and coming proclaimer of the Gospel and as I stated, he did not disappoint the assembly.

Dr. Jerry Young from Jackson, Mississippi, who is the Vice-President at Large in the NBC-USA Inc., under Dr. Julius Scruggs was scheduled to appear, but the weather prevented him from coming to Oklahoma.

I came away from this year's Simultaneous Revival, revived and ready to continue to carry the word of God to all those who are willing to partake of that sharing. We look forward to next year's Revival so that we may be revived again.






