From the Pastor's Desk —

My beloved members,

Emphasis is being placed on Stewardship in our teaching and preaching for the months of October and November here at the Lord's church. For the month of November, I want to place emphasis by asking the question: "Why should every Christian tithe?"



There is ultimately one reason why every Christian should be a tither; because Jesus said we should. Tithing was so deeply embedded in the Jewish conscience that it needed virtually no mention in the New Testament. Tithing was an assumption in Israel when Jesus came on the scene: "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices — mint, dill and cumin. But you have neglected the more important matters of the law — justice, mercy and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former" (Matthew 23:23 NIV). If tithing was a part of the law that would or could be dropped under the New Covenant, that was the place our Lord would have done it. He did not.

Tithing teaches us to put God first in our lives, so that we may learn "to revere the Lord God always" (Deuteronomy 14:23 NIV). It reminds us that we owe all we have to God. That God owns it all and allows us to keep the remainder is a testament to his ownership. It was no easier for the people of Israel to tithe than it is for us today. Tithing is an opportunity to test God's promise to provide.

Tithing works because it changes you. Giving changes the way you view money and possessions. Giving changes your belief that life is about receiving to a new understanding that life is about giving. Giving always guarantees receiving. When you have a spirit of giving, you give not only to God's work but to others as well. Since God is everyone's source, individuals and opportunities are just channels God uses to bless you and increase your supply.

When you give, you can be assured of this God's resources will work their way back to you in many unexpected and bountiful ways!

102 Years: Illuminating the Community

Fairview will observe 102 years of service November 30— December 4, 2011. The observance will begin with the **4th Annual Evangelism Explosion**, November 30—December 2. This three-day event is a time when the church concentrates on evangelism. The members infiltrate the area around the church and their individual communities, seeking out the lost and unchurched, compelling them to come and share in the service.

The Evangelism Explosion will feature different preachers for the daily, one-hour noon-day worship service and the 7:00 p.m. service. Speakers for this year are: Wednesday, November 30, Rev. Harvey Wallace, Pastor of Mt. Rose Baptist Church; Thursday, Dr. Daryl Hairston, Pastor of Tabernacle Baptist Church; and Friday, Rev. Dr. John Peoples, Pastor of the Faith Memorial Baptist Church, all of Oklahoma City.

Rev. Dr. Clarence Morton, National Evangelist from Baltimore, Maryland, will return as the 7:00 p.m. worship preacher. Dr. Morton has written publications and conducted numerous workshops on evangelism, specializing in teachings on "The Cults." He is also a teacher in the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education.

Fairview Evangelism Minister Rev. Cleo McGlory will lead the Fairview membership in witnessing. The schedule for Ministries and the congregation is Saturday, November 26, at 10:00 a.m. and Monday and Tuesday, November 28 and 29, at 6:00 p.m. Ministries are to plan to attend a minimum of three of the six

worship services Wednesday through Friday. As many as 65 state and community persons from government and service organizations have been invited to worship with us during the noon-day services.

The Church's 102nd Anniversary and Homecoming Celebration will culminate on Sunday, December 4. The Church Anniversary activities are led by Chairman Ron Coffey. Colors are red and black.

Fairview Senior Pastor J. A. Reed, Jr. has set a goal of 300 to be in attendance in Sunday School on December 4. At 10:00 a.m., the Tabitha Baptist Church, Oklahoma City, will join us in our worship service. Rev. Jeff Mitchell, Pastor of Tabitha, will bring the message for the worship celebration and Tabitha's choir will sing.

We will end the day with our Homecoming fellowship dinner, immediately following morning worship. All members and guests are encouraged to share in the dinner.

Pastor Reed asked that the church would be in prayer the week of November 21, leading up to the Evangelism Explosion and Church Anniversary. Further directions will be given by Pastor Reed, Minister McGlory and Brother Coffey.

Pastor Reed to Preach for New Baptist Covenant II

The New Baptist Covenant II is a three-day gathering of Baptists from a number of different denominations and ethnic backgrounds. The November 17-19 meeting is a follow-up to the first New Baptist Covenant, a historic 2008 meeting of 15,000 Baptists at a central location in

Atlanta, which brought together Baptists from 40 different denominations and groups for the first time ever – Caucasians, Asians, African-Americans, Hispanics.

Second Ponce de Leon Baptist Church in Atlanta, GA will serve as NBCII's anchor site, hosting worship services and breakout sessions that will be broadcast via satellite to various host cities across the nation. Host cities will provide additional programming and coordinate a day of local missions opportunities on November 19.

In addition to worship services and hands-on ministries, NBC II will include breakout sessions to teach strategies to work for justice, fight poverty and address other human needs that would fulfill the Luke 4 mandate.

The seven churches that will host the satellite-fed gatherings are St. John Missionary Baptist Church in Oklahoma City; Trinity Baptist Church in San Antonio; Israel Baptist Church in Washington, D.C.; St. Luke Memorial Baptist Church in St. Louis; New Beginnings Christian Fellowship in Seattle; Sharon Baptist Church, Philadelphia; and Citizens of Zion Missionary Baptist Church, Compton, Calif.

On Thursday evening, from 6—8pm, the satellite feed will feature Rev. Stephen Thurston, President of the National Baptist convention of America, Rosalynn Carter, former First Lady of the United States and Rev. Ken Fong, Sr., Pastor of the Evergreen Baptist Church, Los Angeles, CA. The Oklahoma City Ambassador Concert Choir will present a concert from 8—9pm.

On Friday, November 18, the satellite feed will feature former US President Jimmy Carter, Judge Wendell Griffen, Little Rock, Arkansas, Rev. Dr. DeeDee Coleman, Pastor, Russell Street Missionary Baptist Church, Detroit.

Pastor, Rev. Dr. John A. Reed, Jr., will give the Keynote Address from the Oklahoma Region on Friday morning from 11am—12 noon. Beginning at 1:30 and continuing until 4:15pm, each region will have Breakout Sessions with various religious leaders. From 4:30—6:00pm, the schedule allows for dinner with the speaker.

Colossians 1:28 must ever be our twofold commission. "We proclaim Him, admonishing (that is evangelism) and teaching everyone with wisdom (that is follow-up) so that we may present everyone perfect in Christ".


